Metro Vancouver's Board Chair and Vice Chair Acclaimed

Burnaby Mayor Mike Hurley and Anmore Mayor John McEwen have been <u>acclaimed as Chair and Vice Chair, respectively</u>, of the Metro Vancouver Boards of Directors.

Chair Hurley and Vice Chair McEwen also oversee the Greater Vancouver Sewerage & Drainage District, Greater Vancouver Water District, and Metro Vancouver Housing Corporation boards. They are elected for a one-year term.

Chair Hurley was first elected as Board Chair in June 2024. Vice Chair McEwen will be serving his third term as Vice Chair.

A Governance Committee was created to actively consider and implement the review's recommendations and to strengthen our practices even further.



Metro Vancouver Housing Advances its 10-Year Plan with Kingston Gardens Completion

Metro Vancouver Housing has completed a new building at <u>Kingston Gardens</u> in Surrey's Guildford neighbourhood. The new building adds 85 new non-market rental homes designed for families, seniors, and people with disabilities. The Kingston Gardens redevelopment is part of the Metro Vancouver Housing 10-Year Plan to expand non-market rental housing and respond to the region's growing housing needs.



Explore One of Metro Vancouver's Most Ecologically Important Wetlands

Widgeon Marsh Regional Park is now open for <u>limited public access</u>, offering opportunities to experience one of the region's most ecologically important wetlands while ensuring its sensitive habitats remain protected. Parking and weekend shuttle reservations are required.



UBCM Sustainability Award Highlights Metro Vancouver's Repair Café Initiative

This fall, Metro Vancouver received the Union of BC Municipalities Community Excellence Award in Sustainability for work expanding repair cafés across the region in collaboration with member jurisdictions. The project was recognized for its social value in empowering citizens, building community, and broad and diverse engagement, in addition to its core waste reduction goals.


At repair cafés, residents bring broken items for free repairs and get advice from skilled community volunteers.



Updated Tool Helps Policymakers Explore Affordable Housing Scenario

Metro Vancouver's new Inclusionary Housing Calculator in 2024 is an interactive, web-based tool to help policymakers, planners, and the general public better understand inclusionary housing. The tool has been updated for 2025 with the latest available data on costs, rents, financing and other variables to keep current with market changes. The tool lets users test a range of policy scenarios to see how different variables impact the feasibility of providing affordable housing in market developments.



Corporate Climate Report Shows Strong Progress Toward 2030 Emissions Target

Metro Vancouver is on track to meet its 2030 target of reducing corporate energy-related greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 45 per cent below 2010 levels. This year's Corporate Climate and Energy Performance Report presents Metro Vancouver's organizational actions and progress in taking meaningful climate action, including investing in cleaner energy, adopting efficient technologies, and continuously improving how energy is used.

Building a Resilient Water System

The Capilano Pump Station backup power system project, part of the broader Capilano Water Supply Area Infrastructure Upgrades, is nearly complete. Full installation is expected by the end of the year, with final testing and commissioning to follow shortly thereafter. The new backup power system is designed to withstand a major earthquake and will operate through power outages, ensuring the delivery of high-quality drinking water to the region.

23,000 Residents Help Keep Surrey Clean Through Free Drop-Off Program

From May to September 2025, the City of Surrey, in collaboration with Metro Vancouver, provided free drop-off for garbage and paid recyclables (up to 100 kilograms) at the North Surrey and Central Surrey recycling and waste centres. Working together reduced costs and increased collection of materials with 23,000 residents dropping off 3,000 tonnes of garbage and recyclables helping to keep the city clean and reduce illegal dumping.

Metro Vancouver is a diverse organization that plans for and delivers regional utility services, including water, sewers and wastewater treatment, and solid waste management. It also monitors and regulates air quality, plans for urban growth, manages a regional parks system, provides affordable rental housing, and serves as a regional federation. The organization is a federation of 21 municipalities, one electoral area, and one treaty First Nation located in the region of the same name. The organization is made up of four separate legal entities, each governed by its own Board of Directors. Board directors are elected officials from member jurisdictions.
