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Prohibited Materials Fact Sheet

Prohibited materials are listed in Part 12 of OBER. The person conducting open burning, must not burn:

- Salt-laden wood: vegetative debris, of any species, that contains salt and
- Accelerants: a substance used to aid ignition or accelerate open burning, including:

 (a) animal carcasses and waste from animal slaughtering; 	(I) fuel and lubricant containers;
	(m) furniture and appliances;
(b) asphalt or asphalt products;	(n) hazardous waste;
(c) batteries;	(o) manure;
(d) biomedical waste;	(p) paint and varnish;
(e) carpets;	
(f) construction waste other than lumber that has	(q) plastics;
not been treated with wood preservatives or	(r) polystyrene foam;
other chemicals and is not coated with paint, varnish, oil or other finishing material;	(s) railway ties;
(g) demolition waste;	(t) rubber;
(h) drywall;	(u) tar paper;
(i) domestic waste;	(v) tires;
(j) electrical wire;	(w) treated or painted wood products;
(k) fibreglass and other fibre-reinforced polymers;	(x) used oil*
