

PUBLIC NOTICE

LICENCE APPLICATION FOR A MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY

TAKE NOTICE THAT Lafarge Canada Inc. has applied to the Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District ("GVS&DD") pursuant to the *Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District Municipal Solid Waste and Recyclable Material Regulatory Bylaw No. 181, as amended* ("the Bylaw"), for a licence.

Purpose and Location

The licence application requests authorization to operate a Material Recovery Facility located at 7611 No. 9 Road, Richmond BC, V6W 1H4. The legal description of the land or premises where the Facility is located is Parcel A Sections 17 and 20 Block 4 North Range 4 West New Westminster District Plan LMP24356. The proposed hours of operation are 7am to 7pm Monday to Saturday.

Processes

The Material Recovery Facility will process landfill bound waste into engineered fuel for consumption by the cement kiln which is on the same property. Materials that are not processed into engineered fuel will be either recycled or residuals disposed of at the landfill. The primary types of material handled will be construction and demolition waste, and plastics/paper. The Facility estimates a >85% recovery rate.

Materials Summary

The licence application proposes the following maximum quantity of materials that would be stored at the Facility at any one time:

This notice is published pursuant to the Bylaw. The licence application is at a preliminary stage where it will be reviewed by the municipality in which the Facility is located.

A person who may be adversely affected by the issuance of the requested licence described in this notice may notify the GVS&DD Solid Waste Manager in writing stating how that person would be affected. The public notification period is no less than 30 days after the publication date of this notice. Aspects of the proposal may change as the application proceeds through the municipal review and public comment processes.

Information collected during the comment period and the time following until a decision on the licence application has been made is done so by Metro Vancouver in accordance to *s.26(c) of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*. The information collected will be used for the purpose of making a decision on the licence application and will be forwarded to the licence applicant for response to the Solid Waste Manager. By submitting a public comment, you consent to such disclosure. Also, your submission may be made available to the public as part of the public record, subject to the provisions of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.
