Barnston Island Regional Park includes two sites at opposite ends of the island. Robert Point Rest Area, acquired in 1995, is about 12 hectares and sits on the western tip of the island. Sixteen hectares at Mann Point, on the eastern end of the island, were added in 2011. There are no facilities at Mann Point but park visitors can enjoy river views.

Both sites conserve ecologically important Fraser River foreshore habitat which supports many species of wildlife such as Great Blue Heron, Double-Crested Cormorant, beaver and mink.

## Planning a Picnic or Special Event?

There is no parking at any time on the road adjacent to the park. Groups requiring a vehicle to transport equipment for a picnic or special event may apply for a Special Use Permit by calling 604-432-6359.





## **Trails and Recreation**

#### Dogs



Dogs are welcome but must be leashed and under control at all times. Even well-trained dogs can frighten or injure park wildlife

and visitors. Please scoop up your dog's poop and dispose of it properly.

There is a Leash-optional Area at Tynehead Regional Park and the City of Surrey has several designated dog off-leash parks including Freedom Dog Park at 154A St & 84th Ave, and Tannery Park at Tannery Rd & Dyke Rd.

#### Cycling



Cycling is permitted at Robert Point Rest Area. To minimize erosion and habitat damage, stay off the shoreline.

## Fishing



Angling is permitted in the park and a federal tidal fishing license is required. For licences and regulations, go to

## Accessibility



At Robert Point Rest Area, trails, toilets and picnic tables are wheelchair accessible.

## No Drinking Water



There is no public source of drinking water on Barnston Island; bring what you need.

## No Liquor, No Camping, No Fires and No Smoking









Liquor, camping and fires are not

park. Smoking is not permitted in regional parks. except in designated areas marked with signs.

## **Enjoy the Park Safely**

Regional parks are natural areas and can present hazards for the unprepared. Look and listen, and be aware of your surroundings. Know your limits, be prepared for changing conditions and obey all signs.

Log booms are located along some sections of the shoreline. For your safety, keep off them.

Travel by foot or bicycle as there are no parking areas on the island. Although the paved dyke road is a lovely place to walk

and cycle, it is narrow, lacks a centre line and is the main access for the island. Dyke Road is a public road; remember standard safety rules-of-the-road apply. Please follow the Island Etiquette beside the map.

The park is open at 7 am. Park hours are posted at park entrances; earliest closing is 5 pm.


## Areas Not Open to the Public

This park is located in a rural community with active farms. When visiting, remember that all lands on Barnston Island, including

the riverfront, are private except for the public road and parkland. Please respect the work and privacy of residents by yielding to farm vehicles; staying in public areas; and making your visit litter-free.

## No Public Parking on Barnston Island



There is no parking at any time on the road adjacent to the park.

## Using the Ferry

Please leave your vehicle on the mainland side of the ferry as:

- there are no public parking areas on Barnston Island;
- the road and its shoulders are too narrow for parking;
- only a few vehicles (up to 6) can cross at a time; and
- vehicles must back off the ferry when they arrive at the island and back on when they leave.

Wait in the marshalling area for instructions from the ferry crew before proceeding onto the ferry.

Make sure you return prior to the last ferry as there is no camping on Barnston Island.
