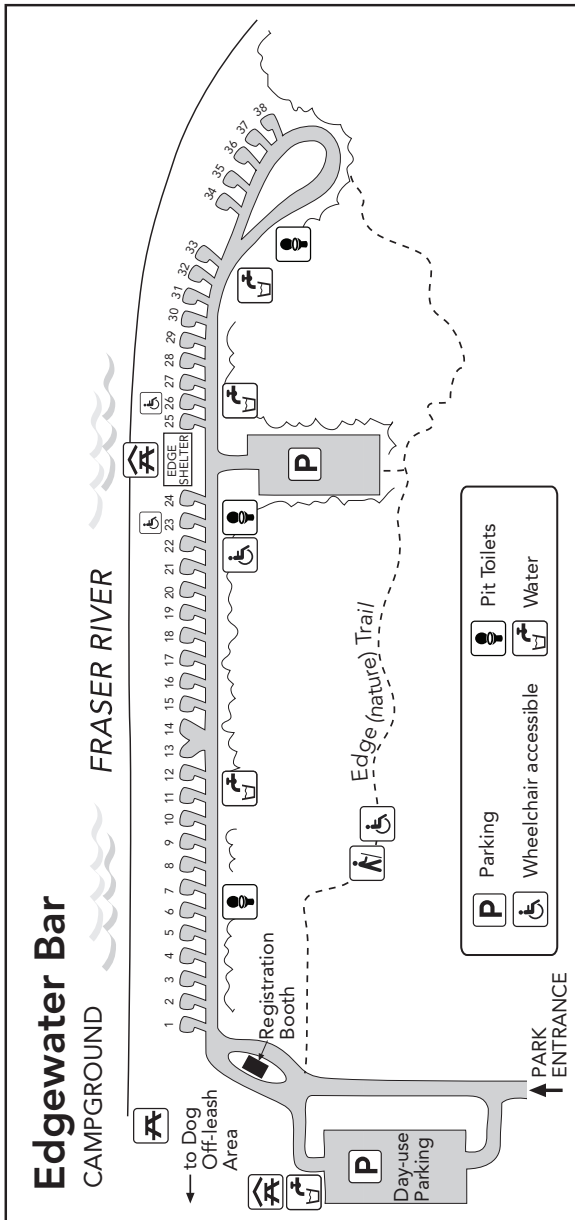

Edgewater Bar Campground has 38 campsites, potable water, wheelchair accessible pit toilets, parking, and a picnic shelter. Each campsite includes a gravel pad, picnic table, and fire pit. The riverbank, grassed areas between sites, and the road are common areas available to all park users.

The campground is open for overnight camping March 1 through October 31. Gates are open 6:00 am – 10:00 pm daily. Campers should check ahead with Metro Vancouver for temporary campground closures.

Day use is not permitted in designated campsites from March 1 – October 31. Day use is permitted outside camping season, during posted park hours.

Campsite Reservations

Online reservations can be made for the entire season beginning on Feb. 1st. Maximum stay is 10 consecutive days. From July 1 through September 30, a camper may not exceed 30 days total.

Camping fees (tax includes):

\$30 per night/camping group

\$27 per night/camping group for seniors and people with disabilities

Fee includes parking for two licensed vehicles/units.

Additional vehicles/units:

\$12 per vehicle/night

\$11 per vehicle/night for seniors and people with disabilities

Visa/MasterCard/Debit is accepted on site for purchase of additional overnight vehicle permit and firewood. Cash will not be accepted.

Universally accessible sites (23, 26) are held for campers displaying a disability placard only.

Any request for refund of camping permits must be applied for through the campground registration booth at 604-882-4903.

Camping Regulations and Etiquette

1. Check-in time is between 1:00 – 10:00 pm; check-out by 11:00 am (no late checkouts permitted).
2. There is no entering or exiting the campground between 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. In case of emergency after park hours, contact the campground host, located at the entrance to the campground.
3. A maximum of one camping group per site is allowed. A camping group may consist of up to eight people maximum, and must include a minimum of one to a maximum of four adults (19 years or older) per campsite.
4. Only persons 19 or older may register for a camping permit. The adult permit holder must occupy the site overnight and be responsible for all members of the camping group and any non-registered visitors to their site. Minors must be accompanied by an adult.
5. A camping group must have a valid camping permit to occupy a campsite overnight. Camping permits are not transferable.
6. Your RV or tent must be parked or pitched at your registered campsite by 10:00 pm. Sites not occupied overnight may be registered to other campers the next day.
7. A maximum of two licensed vehicles/units (which includes only one RV, camper, or trailer in total), are allowed on a campsite at any time. These vehicles/units must be parked on the gravel portion of the site. Any additional overnight vehicles/units require an additional permit and must be parked in the overflow parking lot.
8. Driving speed must not exceed 10 km/hr. Park only in designated areas. There is no parking along roadsides or between campsites.
9. Tents must be set up on the designated gravel pad.
10. Visitors to your registered campsite must leave by 10:00 pm. No visitors are allowed to enter or stay after the campground is closed. Visitors may only park in designated parking areas.
11. Quiet time is from 10:00 pm – 6:00 am. Regardless of the time, if a noise or activity is disruptive, park officials will require it to cease. Generators must be well muffled and are only permitted to operate between the hours of 9:00 am – 11:00 am, and 6:00 pm – 8:00 pm. Amplified music is not permitted.
12. A camping group must leave a registered campsite free and clear when checking out. A camping group is not permitted to leave any vehicles, trailers, RVs, campers or items at the campsite for another camping group.
13. Campsites are to be kept clean and all refuse is to be placed in the waste bins provided. Fire pits are not to be used as garbage receptacles. Food containers and coolers are to be stored in a manner to prevent access by wildlife. Do not leave containers of food or coolers unattended or in the open.
14. Camping groups that breach the permit conditions or park rules and regulations may be evicted from the park without refund for the camping permit.

Fires



Fires are permitted only in the designated fire rings. Only clean, natural firewood is to be burned. Burning of plastic, metal, glass, painted or treated lumber, pallets, or excess paper is not permitted. Fires must always be supervised and cannot be left unattended at any time. Protect air quality by limiting burning. Fires will be banned during air quality and fire danger restrictions.

Firewood is sold for \$9 per bundle at the campground registration booth and through online camping reservations. Note: The camp host does not sell firewood. Pay by Debit, Visa or MasterCard. Cash will not be accepted.

Smoking



Smoking and use of e-cigarettes is not permitted in regional parks, except in designated areas marked by signs. Registered campers are permitted to smoke on the gravel portion of their campsite.

Fishing



Contact Fisheries and Oceans Canada at 604-666-0384 or visit pac.dfo-mpo.gc.ca for updates to fisheries regulations and to obtain a Tidal Sports Fishing License.

Fish remains and bait attract pests. Please clean up your campsite and use the provided waste bins. Do not cut bait or clean fish directly on picnic tables.

Boat Launch



Canoes, kayaks and car-top boats must be carried from your campsite or parking space. Trailers must not be driven or pushed onto the riverbank or any grassed area between campsites.

There is no motor boat launch at Derby Reach Regional Park. The nearest boat launch is located at Marina Park in Fort Langley.

Pets



Pets must be leashed and under control at all times. Please clean up after your pets. The designated off-leash area is located just west of the day-use area.

No Vegetation Removal



Damaging or removing plants or deadfall is prohibited.
