

Nature-friendly Dog Walking in Regional Parks

Regional parks are great places for people and dogs to visit. They're also important as habitat for wildlife such as birds, bees, salamanders, deer & bears.



Metro Vancouver Regional Parks has developed a few rules to keep pets, people, wildlife and habitat healthy and safe.

Canine Code of Conduct

- Be in control of your dog at all times.
- Scoop poop & put it in dog waste bins.
- Keep dogs out of streams, wetlands & other designated wildlife habitat.
- Keep dogs on trail.
- Ensure your dog doesn't jump on people or chase wildlife.



As Metro Vancouver grows, there are fewer natural areas for wildlife. Regional parks provide habitat for many species – including those at risk.

When you're in a regional park, you become part of the community that shares that park.

By respecting park rules, you help protect the park community and keep it healthy. Thanks!
