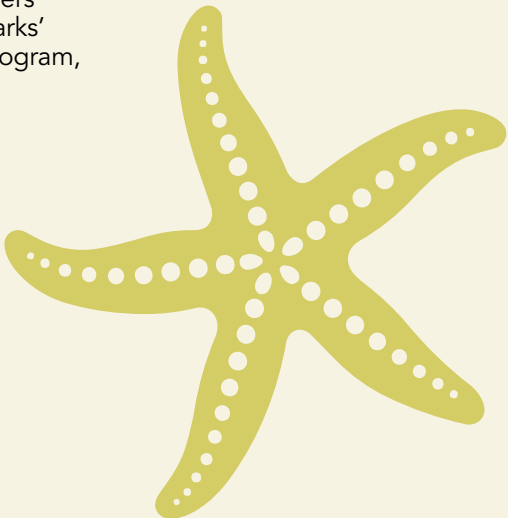


Beach Creatures Star in Unique Interpretive/ stewardship Program

At təmtə́míxʷtən/Belcarra Regional Park, a unique program takes place each summer that helps park visitors get to know beach creatures such as sea cucumbers, sea stars, and barnacles a little better. At the same time, that program helps protect important marine habitat — a win-win scenario for everyone.

Led by a park interpreter and supported by volunteers (typically youth interested in natural sciences), Beachkeepers is Metro Vancouver Regional Parks' longest running stewardship program, established in 1997.

For years, Beachkeeper volunteers have also helped gather important data on red rock and Dungeness crabs that attract recreational fishers. They record the size, species, and sex of the crab and note whether it has any injuries. They then tag the crab. That data is provided to Fisheries and Oceans Canada, a key funding partner of the Beachkeepers program.

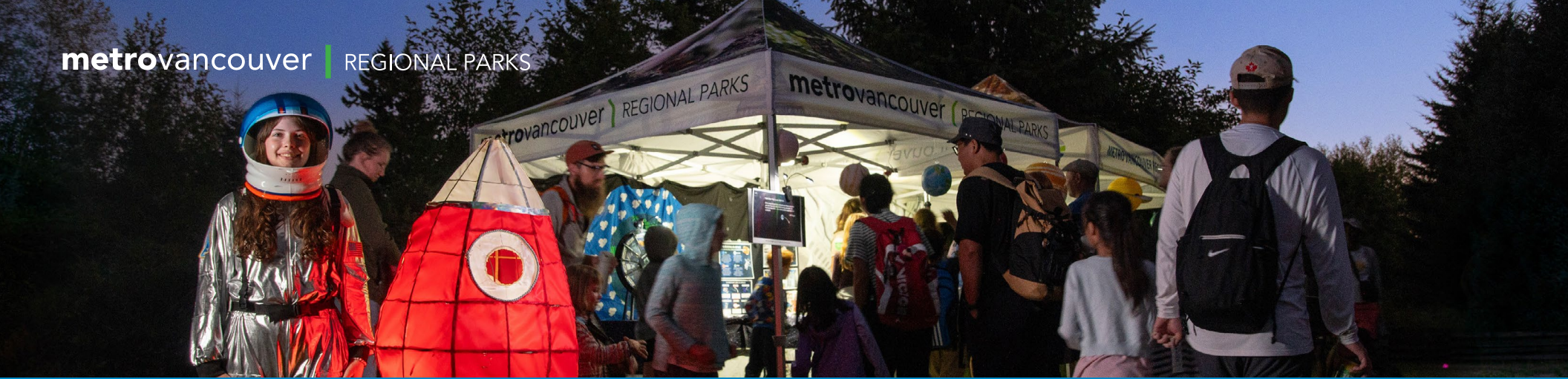
