Meeting Notes

1. MEMBER INTRODUCTION

The meeting began with member introductions

2. FOCUS TOPIC DISCUSSION

Karen Storry, Metro Vancouver Senior Engineer with Solid Waste Planning, gave a presentation on C&D materials and Metro Vancouver initiatives and regional statistics. Topics included:

- Regional Recycling and disposal statistics in 2022
- 2022 Construction and demolition waste composition study results
- Demolitions numbers in 2022
- Disposal ban program overview
- Gypsum recycling program
- C&D waste reduction and alternatives to demolition
- Metro Vancouver solid waste regulatory framework and tools

Questions and comments:

Question on licensed facilities: the map on slide 12 makes it look like there are a lot options
for disposal, but many of the licensed facilities are not operating or not consistently accepting
materials. Would be helpful to get a list of facilities that are operating and details on what they
accept/don't accept, limitations, etc.

Metro Vancouver Staff Action Item: Confirm licensed facilities that accept C&D waste that are currently operating, confirm materials currently being accepted at operating locations.



Focus area discussion:

- 1. Receiving facilities and capacity
 - Facilities need more capacity to take material
 - · Reliable and accurate receiving facility reporting needs to be improved and verified
 - Greater transparency and accountability is needed with respect to what receiving facilities are doing with the materials
 - Need for consistent language and definitions for diversion, recycling, downcycling and so fourth

2. End markets for the products

- Markets for the clean wood are very challenging
- Demand for the product options for building demand and overall market capacity should be a topic for the working group to consider
- Innovative ideas for storage and processing space for materials

3. Focus on wood

- What is happening with the wood? Where are the end users? What portion goes to fuel?
- Are there new or emerging end markets?
- Look at what is happening in Washington State with wood recycling that we can learn from?
- How can the province help what are the assets provincewide?

4. C&D guide to move up the waste-hierarchy

• using the World Business Council for sustainable building hierarchy – can we build nothing, can we build less? Community energy association – guide for the hierarchy docs.communityenergy.ca/wp-content/uploads/Embodied-Emissions-Guide Final.pdf

5. Carbon perspective

- How does C&D waste tie into climate action, green building, low energy building work?
- Consider challenges, such as land-use changes and zoning, specifically BC, Vancouver, and Victoria legislation "enabling small-scale, multi-unit housing" – how to deter demolition?

6. Construction waste procurement guidelines

- Need technical and/or policy support for the procurement of green building and waste
- Could consider post-secondary school forums and pilots for new ideas

7. Research and Policy

Consider World Business Council's recommendations for the Built Environment
