





### Metro Vancouver\* and City of Vancouver Waste Quantities Monthly Inbound Garbage Tonnage

SUBJECT: Amendment to Hazardous Waste Regulation Registration for Asbestos Disposal

- Vancouver Landfill

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide notification of the City of Vancouver's (the City's) pending application to amend the Vancouver Landfill's registration for waste asbestos disposal under the Provincial Hazardous Waste Regulation (HWR).

The City is intending to request an amendment to the approved registration to allow for waste asbestos disposal at an annual rate of <u>up to</u> 20,000 tonnes per year. This proposed annual limit will allow the City to continue accepting waste asbestos at current annual disposal rates which have ranged between 8,000 to14,000 tonnes per year since 2017. It is expected this request will be classified by the Province as a significant amendment and as such, the City will be required to provide notification to the public, local municipalities and waste management planning committees. Formal notification will occur once the amendment request is submitted.

The Landfill provides safe and convenient disposal of waste asbestos for all of Metro Vancouver. This HWR registration amendment will ensure that the Landfill can continue to provide this regional service in the future.








### 1. Please indicate how you participated in the September 7th workshop:





5	Pref. Online for work. If the idea is to get us to better collaborate than I sugg. a diff. intent for in-per. in person, I felt the enviro. was hostile and intense because some of those in attendance were not respectful in dealing w/ disagreements.
7	It is nigh on impossible for "facilitators" who do not understand the concepts or vernacular of the industry to provide any effective feedback. Their summaries of the points made were vague and their ability to communicate them with precision poor.
8	Virtual attendees feel left out during the breakout discussions. There were almost twice as many virtual attendees than there were in person. That leaves too many not able to effectively participate. Zoom needs to be used in breakout discussions
10	While my schedule didn't allow for me to make the trip to Metro Vancouver offices for this meeting, moving forward, I would make every effort to attend in person if this is the only way to join breakouts. A virtual breakout could have been useful.
11	Ask for topics prior to the workshop
