## **MEETING MINUTES**

Co-Chair Craig Hodge called the meeting to order at 2:04 p.m. and welcomed attendees to the Solid Waste and Recycling Industry Advisory Committee meeting. Participants were reminded to use the Zoom "raised hand" function to provide questions or comments or for any voting that might be required, and to ensure their names were correctly identified in the Participant list.

#### 1. AGENDA

## 1.1 May 14, 2024, Meeting Agenda

Co-Chair Hodge reviewed the May 14, 2024, meeting agenda. No additions were made.

#### 2. MINUTES

## 2.1 April 9, 2024, Meeting Minutes

Co-Chair Hodge called for any additions or changes to the meeting Minutes of April 9, 2024. There were no changes or additions to the meeting Minutes of April 9, 2024.

## 3. REPORTS

## 3.1 Items of Interest

Paul Henderson, General Manager, Solid Waste, Metro Vancouver, reviewed two items of interest:

- A report has been published in the upcoming May 16, 2024, Mayor's Committee meeting agenda updating on the smart waste program and draft Tipping Fee Bylaw updates
- Regarding Notice of Bylaw Violation Enforcement and Dispute Adjudication Bylaw, all Industry Advisory Committee members should have received information via email about the engagement process. Feedback is welcome until May 31, 2024. The Notice of Bylaw Violation:
  - Provides an additional compliance promotion tool for GVS&DD Solid Waste & Recyclable Material Regulatory Bylaw No. 181, 1996
  - o Establishes penalties u to \$500 for violations of exiting Bylaw 181 provisions
  - Serves as an additional tool for Metro Vancouver to encourage Bylaw compliance.

## 3.2 Construction and Demolition Waste Management and Capacity

Adriana Velázquez, Senior Project Engineer, Solid Waste, reviewed a presentation on construction and demolition (C&D) materials, noting the following highlights:

- About half of waste and recyclable materials generated in the region come from the C&D sector
- Metro Vancouver's 2022 C&D waste composition study showed that more than half of the disposed material in the region is wood
- In 2022, there were 2,371 residential demolitions limited information is available on how much of this is being repurposed through deconstruction or home relocation
- The Disposal Ban Program places a surcharge on disposal loads containing 5% or more of clean wood and any quantity of gypsum
- Metro Vancouver recently updated the C&D waste reduction and recycling toolkit to encourage reuse of building materials

- Current regulatory tools and frameworks include the tipping fee, a Solid Waste and Recyclable Material Bylaw, facility inspections, permitting, and enforcement
- A list of licensed facilities is posted online this list is currently being updated
- 10 municipalities in Metro Vancouver have implemented diversion requirements for construction and demolition materials

Committee members joined small break-out groups to discuss construction and demolition waste. Co-Chair Hodge introduced the following questions for discussion:

- What are some of the current challenges for C&D waste?
- What could be improved?
- What are some examples of different solutions?

Co-Chair Hodge thanked participants for the discussion.

A summary of the input received during small group discussions and plenary report-back will be posted separately on the Industry Advisory Committee webpage under the Meetings header. Feedback from this session will be considered as part of the idea generation phase of engagement for the solid waste management plan update.

## 4. OTHER BUSINESS

## 4.1 Work Plan Review

Co-Chair Bryan reviewed the amended Work Plan, noting the following:

- The Work Plan has been updated to include dates when key topics will be presented
- Recycling capacity, product markets, and organics will be discussed at the next meeting in June 2024
- Long-term disposal planning and capital budget will be discussed at the meeting in July 2024
- In September 2024, the generator levy and competition will be the topics of discussion.

Based on feedback from the April Industry Advisory Committee meeting, an additional meeting was added to the work plan in July. A Zoom poll was conducted and it was decided that the meeting would occur virtually on July 9, 2024.

## 4.2 Zero Waste Committee Updates

Paul Henderson provided an update on Zero Waste Committee work, noting the following highlights:

- An update on two recycling depots being developed in Langley and North Surrey; completion of these facilities will provide consistent services across the region that maximize recycling opportunities
- A report updating on the food scraps campaign
- Items in the Manager's Report included a Waste-to-Energy facility operational certificate amendment application, and single-use items campaign update

## Other updates included:

 Need for further recruitment for the Public/Technical Advisory Committee has been identified. Focused outreach to fill some identified sector representation gaps will be initiated.

- A recent article was published on the Vancouver Landfill in a Delta-based newspaper
