## MEETING MINUTES

---

Co-Chair Craig Hodge called the meeting to order at 2:04 p.m. and welcomed attendees to the Solid Waste and Recycling Industry Advisory Committee (Industry Advisory Committee) meeting. Members were reminded to ensure their full name was visible on the Zoom platform so attendance could be confirmed and that they had access to the Zoom raised hand function in preparation for voting.

### **1. AGENDA**

#### **1.1 February 4, 2025, Meeting Agenda**

Co-Chair Hodge reviewed the February 4, 2025, meeting agenda. No additions were made.

### **2. MINUTES**

#### **2.1 January 7, 2025, Meeting Minutes**

Co-Chair Hodge called for any additions or changes to the Minutes of the January 7, 2025 Industry Advisory Committee Meeting. No changes or additions were brought forward.

### **3. REPORTS AND ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION**

#### **3.1 Solid Waste Management Plan Update: Timeline Updates**

Terry Fulton, Senior Project Engineer, Solid Waste Planning, shared a presentation titled “Solid Waste Management Plan Update – Timeline Update”. The presentation highlighted the following:

- Completion of many of the direction-setting steps, including the vision and guiding principles, and near completion of the idea generation phase
- Feedback from idea generation engagement will be summarized into a report and will inform the development of the options analysis phase
- Currently working towards submitting the draft updated solid waste management plan to the Province in 2026
- The solid waste management plan’s goals will be closely tied to the waste hierarchy
- Targets will be used to measure progress
- Actions and strategies are specific components of the plan and include:
  - Regulatory framework
  - Residuals management options framework
  - Options analysis criteria
  - Recycling and waste centre requirements
- Opportunities for the Industry Advisory Committee to have input on:
  - Goals and hierarchy
  - Options analysis criteria
  - Targets and performance indicators
  - Framework for residuals management options decisions
  - Framework for regulatory initiatives
  - Evaluation of actions and strategies.

### **4. VOTING ITEM: 2025 INDUSTRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE WORK PLAN**

The updated Draft Industry Advisory Committee Work Plan was reviewed, and the following highlighted:

- Previous feedback on what should be prioritized in the 2025 Work Plan:
  - The solid waste management plan update

- Disposal options, including contingency disposal, waste-to-energy, and the Vancouver Landfill
- Soil management
- Carry-over items from the 2024 Work Plan
- The Work Plan was developed through input from the Industry Advisory Committee members, Co-Chairs, and the solid waste management plan project team
- Solid waste management plan update topics have been indicated with “SWMP” on the work plan

Paul Henderson, General Manager, Solid Waste Services, welcomed any additional proposals or amendments to the 2025 Work Plan prior to the vote.

During discussion, it was suggested that the “hierarchy for solid waste management” tied closely with solid waste management plan goals. The Work Plan was amended to include “Draft Goals and Hierarchy”.

Co-Chair Hodge reminded members of the process for motions to be approved, per the Industry Advisory Committee Terms of Reference.

**It was MOVED and SECONDED**

That the Draft 2025 Solid Waste and Recycling Industry Advisory Committee Work Plan be approved as amended.

**5. NEXT STEPS**

**5.1 2025 Industry Advisory Committee Membership Call for Submissions Reminder – Submissions date February 12, 2025**

Committee members were reminded that 2025 Industry Advisory Committee membership submissions were due on February 12, 2025. The Committee members were thanked for their contributions to the committee over the past year and were encouraged to consider continuing participation on the committee. A final email reminder for membership submission would be sent on February 10, 2025. Members were invited to reach out to Metro Vancouver staff with any related questions.

**5.2 Co-Chair Nominations in March**

Co-Chair Hodge advised that nominations for the Industry Advisory Committee Co-Chair would be accepted at the March 4, 2025, Industry Advisory Committee Meeting. Additional nominations would be received up to the election at the April 2025 meeting.

**6. OTHER BUSINESS**

**6.1 WMABC Conference – February 27, 2025**

Co-Chair Hodge advised that the Waste Management Association of British Columbia (WMABC) Conference would be held on February 27, 2025, and would include industry presentations, learning sessions, and networking opportunities.

Lori Bryan, Co-Chair, further informed that the one-day WMABC Conference would be held at the Sheraton Hotel in Guildford, Surrey. Government and provincial updates would be

provided along with sessions related to deconstruction and reuse and pioneers of recycling, among other topics.

## **6.2 Zero Waste Committee and Other Updates**

Paul Henderson reviewed the agenda for the February 6, 2025, Zero Waste Committee Meeting and noted the meeting would be livestreamed.

Meeting agenda topics include:

- An update on activities related to the Zero Waste Conference on November 27, 2025, and the National Zero Waste Council:
  - The Zero Waste Conference is to be held every two years
  - A potential theme being considered was making the business case for waste prevention
- Public /Technical Advisory Committee update to Terms of Reference
- Annual solid waste and recycling statistics
- Engagement panel recruitment is ongoing
- Procurement for recycling and waste centre operations and maintenance service contracts in light of five facility contracts expiring in 2025:
  - Two separate Request for Proposal processes; one for three larger facilities and another for two smaller ones.

A Committee member alerted Metro Vancouver staff that they had no longer been receiving email notifications of upcoming Zero Waste Committee Meetings. Metro Vancouver staff noted they would look into the past process and follow up with the member. Staff would additionally circulate an invitation to “save the date” for the Zero Waste Conference on November 27, 2025, noting that the fee would be waived for Industry Advisory Committee members.

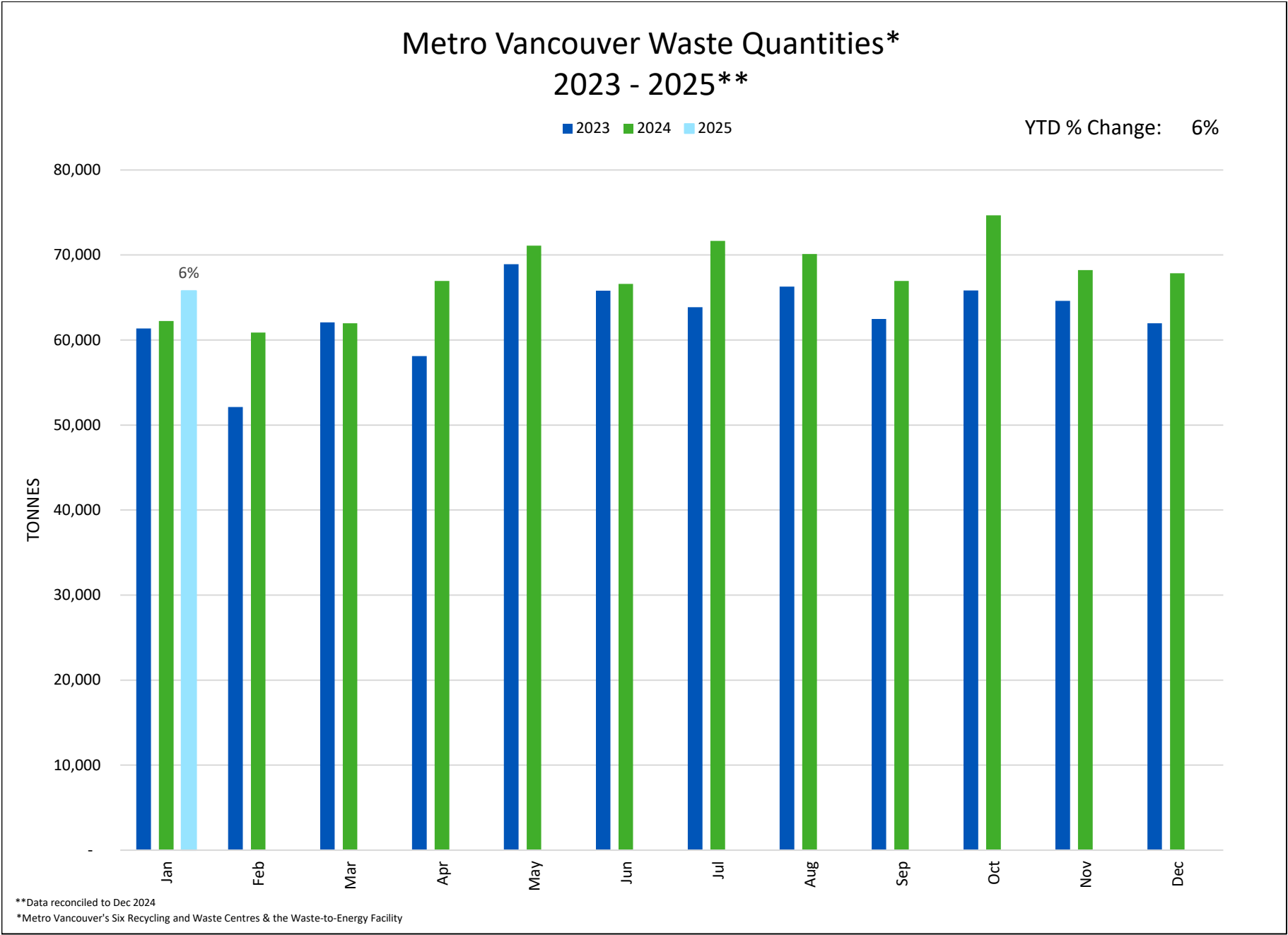
No additional questions or comments were put forward regarding the information items.

The Solid Waste and Recycling Industry Advisory Committee meeting adjourned at 2:35 p.m.

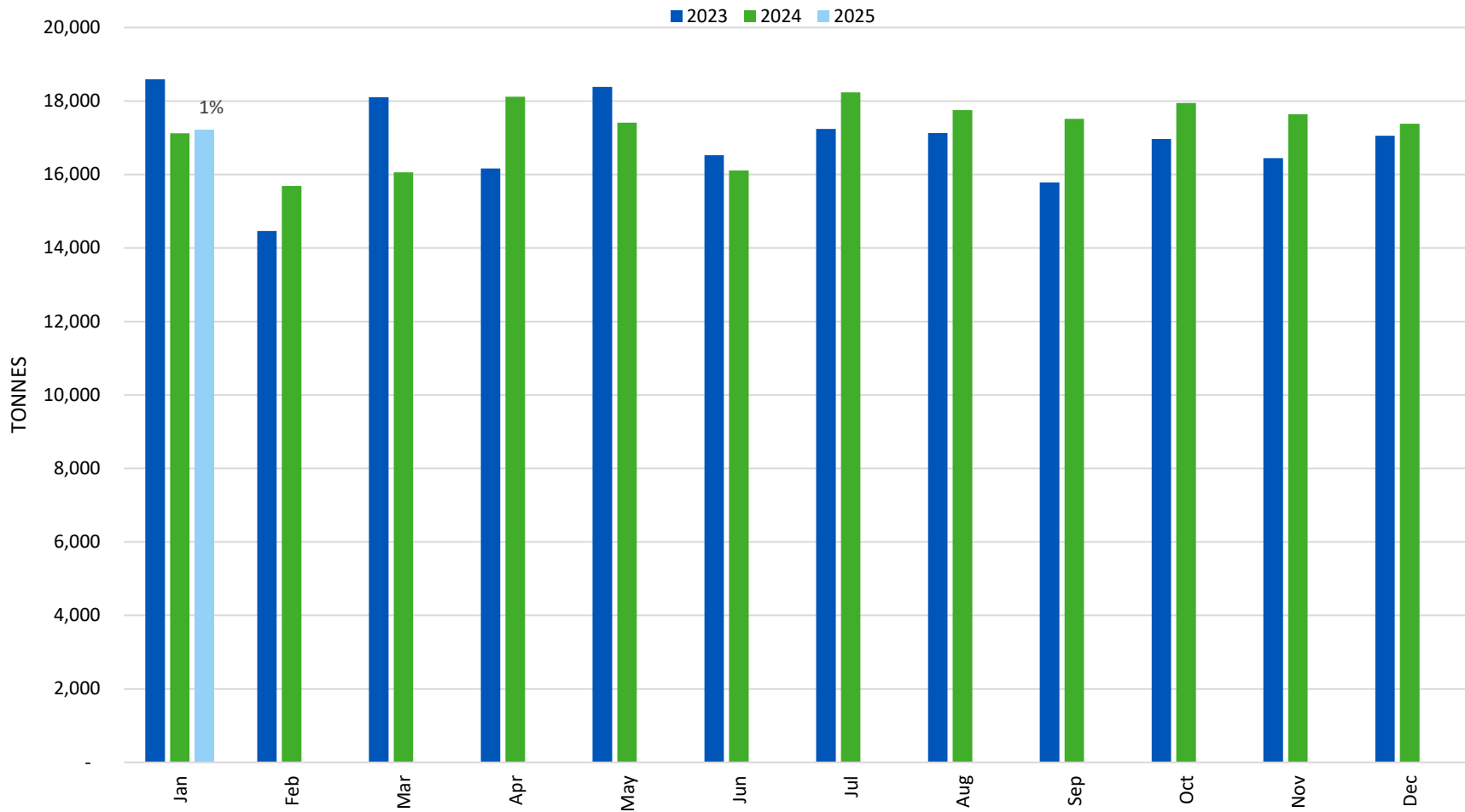


# City of Vancouver Waste Quantities\*

YTD % Change: 1%



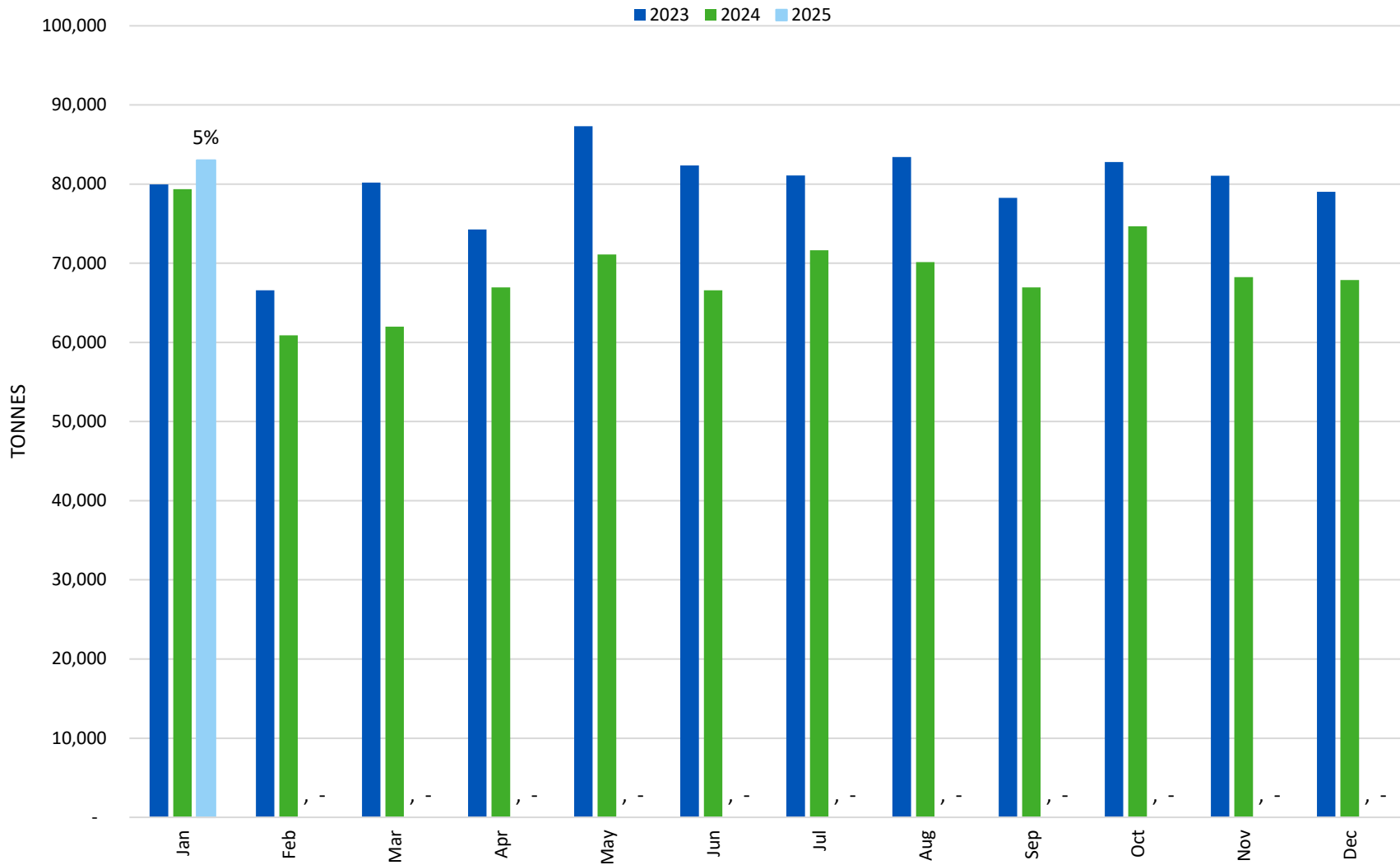

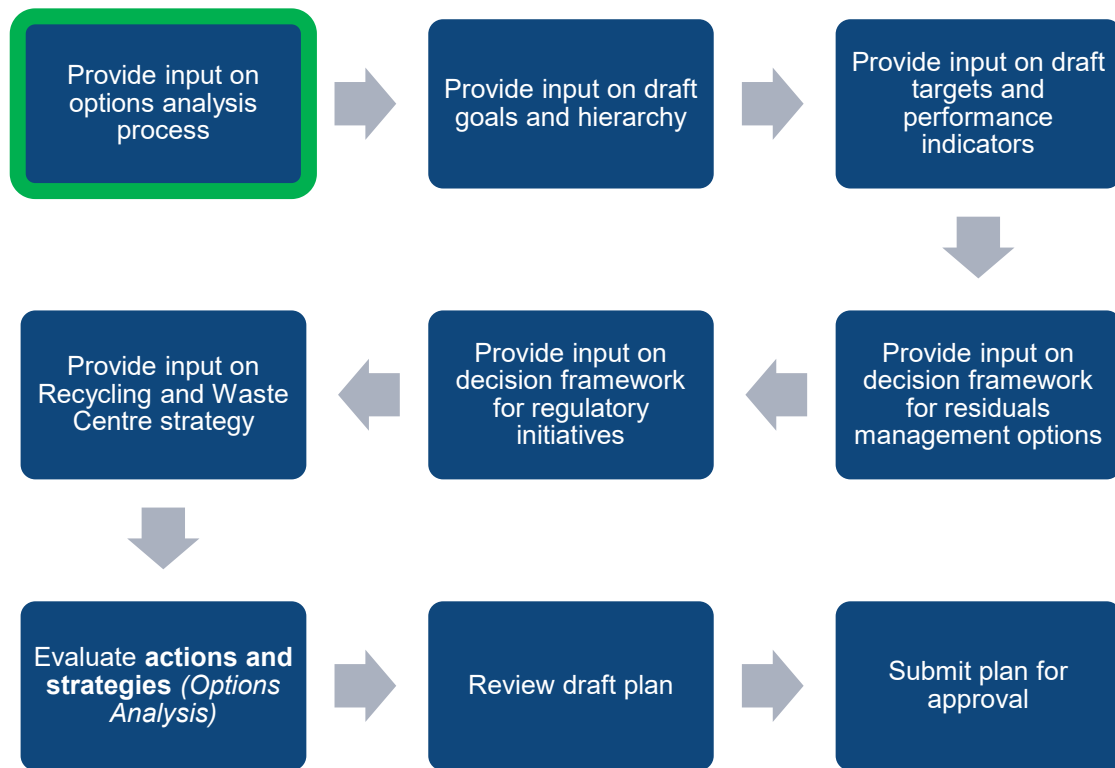

- Infrastructure, ecosystems, and communities resilient to the impacts of climate change



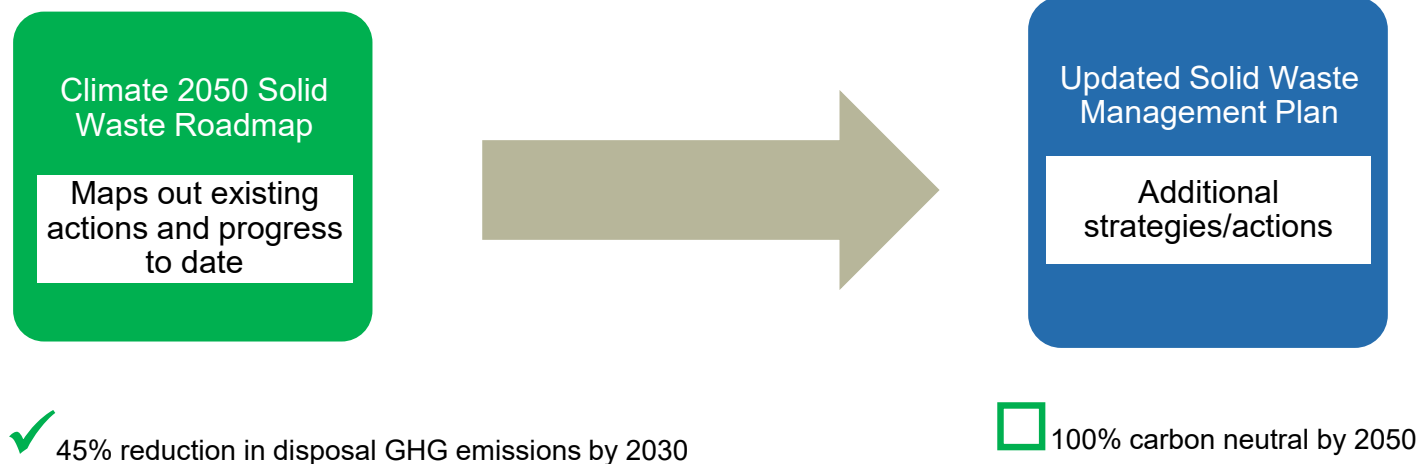

## Climate 2050 Roadmaps



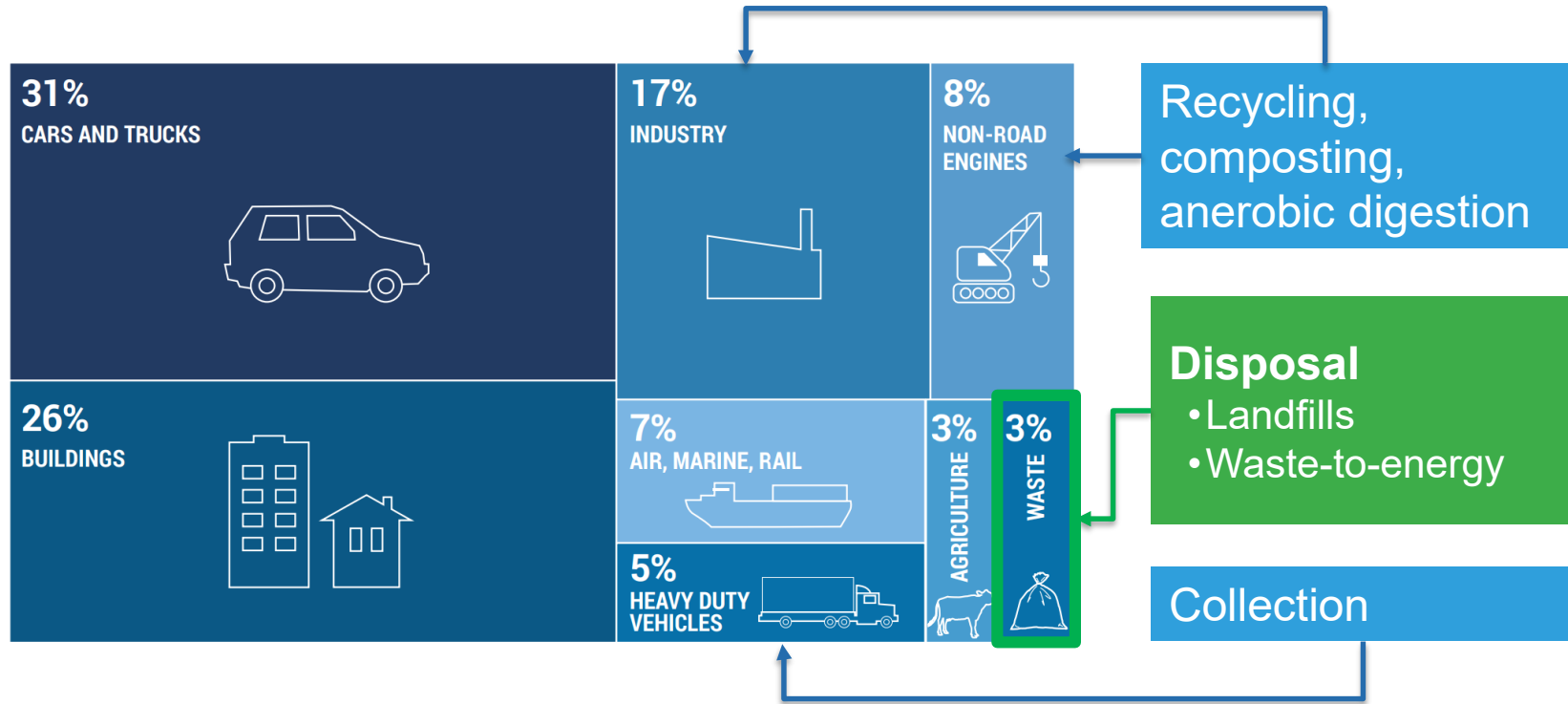

Climate 2050 Roadmap relationship to solid waste management plan



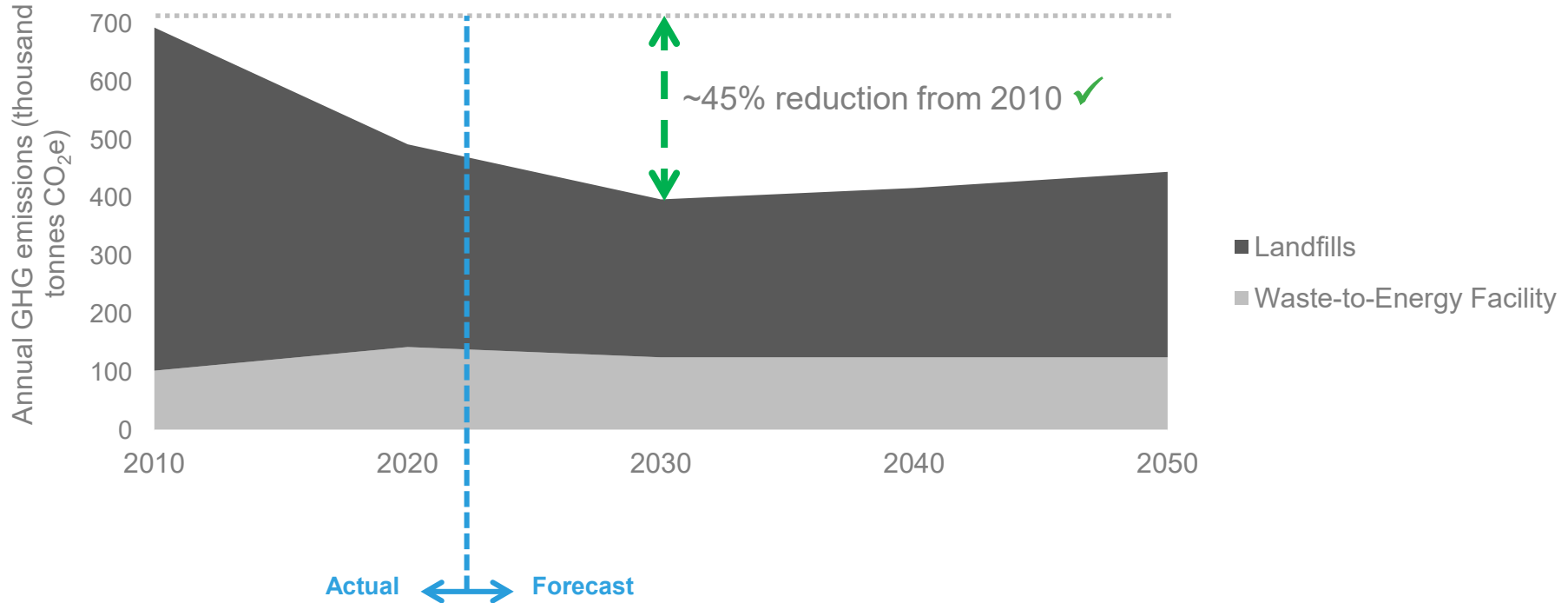
# CLIMATE 2050 SOLID WASTE ROADMAP

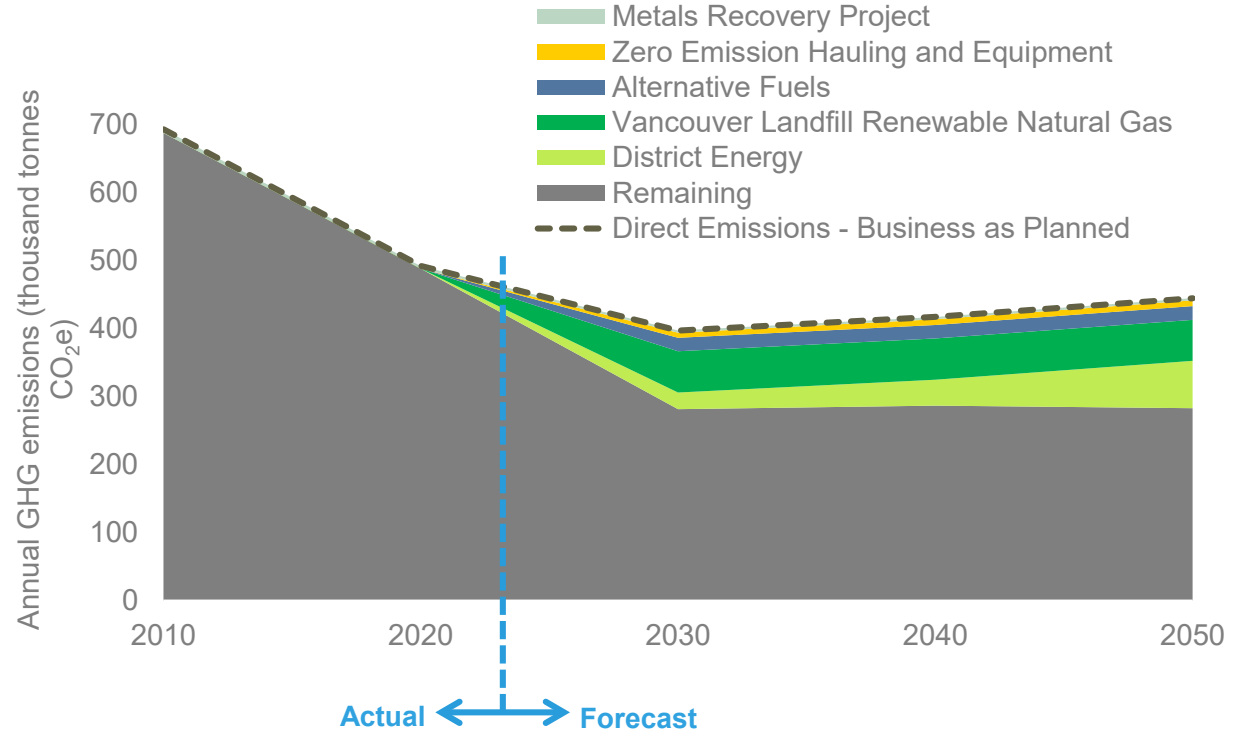
Baseline inventory of Metro Vancouver solid waste disposal emissions

# SOLID WASTE EMISSION OFFSET PROJECTS

## Buildings Roadmap

- **District Energy** - Metro Vancouver is developing a district energy system which will use excess heat from Waste-to-Energy Facility to heat up to 50,000 homes with a potential to reduce up to 70,000 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub>e emissions annually.

## Transportation Roadmap

- **Zero Emissions Hauling** - In 2023 Metro Vancouver worked with member jurisdictions and hauling companies to assess the business case for using zero emission vehicles for transporting solid waste, biosolids, and curbside waste collection.

## Industry and Business Roadmap

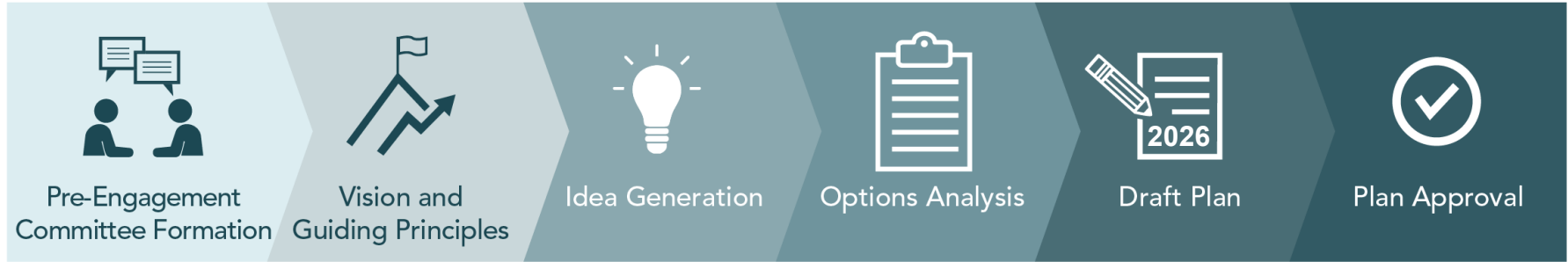
- **Zero Emissions Equipment:** Under new contracts Metro Vancouver's recycling and waste centre operators will be required to use renewable diesel for non-road mobile equipment and trucks that haul garbage to the Waste-to-Energy Facility and Vancouver Landfill, with incentives for transitioning to zero-emission equipment.
- **Metals Recovery:** Metals recovery and bottom ash beneficial use at Waste-to-Energy Facility (2018)



**Industry and Business Roadmap – Strategy 2:** Reduce non-road emissions and support early adoption of zero emission non-road equipment & **Strategy 4:** Reduce emissions through procurement and other business practices
