AGENDA

- 1. Keeping facilities open managing potential staff reductions
 - WMABC: the morning opening hours are more important for their members
 - WMABC: increase in residential waste and recycling as people are spending more time at home. Might be only in this initial phase, or may become ongoing.

- Metro Vancouver is developing a plan and messages in the event of potential operational challenges, and will seek feedback from WMABC. Will discuss further at next meeting.
- Metro Vancouver (Brent) to report on wait times at the Waste-to-Energy Facility
- 2. Potential temporary disposal ban relaxations
 - Data so far does not indicate any clear trend on disposal ban surcharges. Metro Vancouver will continue to monitor waste/recycling quantities, disposal ban surcharges, and traffic/visits.
 - Have heard that organics processors are seeing an increase in residential organics but decrease in commercial organics, and have sufficient capacity to manage current levels.
 - Ability to relax surcharges on a case by case basis. Health authorities have received a relaxation in disposal ban of recyclable materials, which are now being sent to the Waste-to-Energy Facilities.

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver and WMABC (Grant Hankins) will follow up on potential concerns that recyclables may be picked up in general waste loads from care homes, without being redirected to the Waste-to-Energy Facility.
- 3. Payment deferrals
 - Metro Vancouver is not granting payment deferrals at this time. Businesses are recommended to seek relief via federal programs.
 - WMABC may write a letter to Metro Vancouver to request payment deferrals and explain reasons. Paul Henderson will advise Jerry Dobrovolny that a letter may be coming.
- 4. System impact in case of border restrictions on waste movement
 - No issues at the border so far.
 - If waste collection and processing is deemed an essential service, it will be easier to maintain border crossing.
 - So far everything is flowing smoothly. No slow-downs at the border
 - Processes are in place to ensure drivers who cross the border are isolated from other staff to reduce risk.
- 5. Essential business definition as it applies to solid waste and recycling services
 - WMABC will provide feedback on Metro Vancouver's draft essential business definition, to be sent to the province for consideration.
- 6. PPE best practices
 - Beneficial to share best practices about safety and PPE
 - Drivers have less access to public restrooms to wash their hands, and low/no supply of hand sanitizer.

- WMABC (Dave Millman) will send some information on practices and procedures implemented by Waste Management's crews. May be shared more broadly (not confidential).
- Metro Vancouver (Paul Henderson) will mention these challenges to the province, noting they are challenges shared by drivers, couriers and truck drivers as well.
- WMABC (Lori Bryan) will reach out to BCTA to find out if they have solutions discussions/solutions around this.
- Metro Vancouver (Chris Allan) to look into enhancing washroom / hand washing facilities at transfer stations.

- 7. Disposal ban information
 - No identifiable new trends in surcharge levels at this time (see Agenda Item 2)


Daily and Weekly Waste Volumes and Loads









- 1. MV Facility Operational Updates
 - Disposal ban on expanded polystyrene still in effect as processing capacity still exists (polled local processors)
 - In communication with Recycle BC hoping that they can begin to accept expanded polystyrene once more, once their processor works through the stockpile that built up during their shut-down
- 2. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - No longer selling compost at Vancouver Landfill, and no longer selling backyard composters at the transfer station
 - No longer accepting clothing or expanded polystyrene
 - No longer accepting new drywall due to paperwork required to be passed from customers to staff
 - Not allowing walk-ins at Zero Waste Centre
 - Investigating how to manage increased litter, especially as micro cleaning services have stopped operation
- 3. Curbside collection programs Surrey and Vancouver
 - Recent press release about changes in collection services
- 4. Contingency planning for potential operational challenges
 - Described a series of case scenarios and the general contingency plan
 - Scenarios included shut down of the Waste-to-Energy Facility, and progressive reduction in transfer station staffing resulting in possible reduction of hours, restriction to service account customers only, and shut down of a facility
 - WMABC provided feedback that if hours were to be reduced, an early open time is important

- Similarly, City of Vancouver is undertaking some contingency planning, with the goal of keeping facilities open if possible. Identifying minimum staffing requirements to keep facilities open. Staff shortages could result in reduced hours (e.g. reducing from 2 shifts to 1 shift per day)

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to send WMABC (Lori Bryan) some options for reduced operating hours in the case of staff reductions, for feedback. COMPLETE (April 2)
- WMABC to gather feedback from commercial haulers on key hours.
- 5. Wait times at Waste-to-Energy Facility
 - Wait times have been higher than previous year in the last couple of weeks, due to a mini shut down (for cleaning/maintenance) and work on fly ash silo (which is now complete)
 - Expect wait times to be back to normal next week

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to forward information to WMABC on the next Waste-to-Energy Facility mini shut-down of the Waste-to-Energy Facility happening in a few days COMPLETE (April 2)
- Metro Vancouver to provide weekly data on total time spent at the Waste-to-Energy Facility (i.e. time spent between inbound and outbound scales) for discussion at next meeting
- 6. Waste and recyclable material from care homes
 - Metro Vancouver has contact the heath authorities but has not heard back yet.
 - 19 care homes have reported COVID-19 cases. Unsure if that will impact waste or recycling
 - Dave Millman confirmed that for their customers, everything from a care home or health care facility must be bagged and brought to the outside of the facility before pick-up
 - Haulers do not handle waste, even if it is overflowing in a bin. Automated collection only
 - Waste Management, Supersave and AJM Disposal have all been scheduling extra pick-ups due to increased waste volumes

- Metro Vancouver to provide any feedback from heath authorities to WMABC at next meeting
- 7. Essential business definition as it applies to solid waste and recycling services
 - MV received feedback from WMABC, RCBC, SWANA, and member jurisdictions on essential business definition as it applies to solid waste and recycling services
 - Province published their list of essential businesses before MV had a chance to speak with them
 - MV followed up with MOECSS on Tuesday morning via email shared the list we generated and asked questions about their interpretation of their essential services definition (e.g. are Return-It Depots included? C&D?)
 - WMABC developed a template document for hauling companies to provide to their drivers, describing their job as an essential service. This is important for drivers on-the-job and also during their commute to work. There are two versions – a detailed one, which was shared with EMBC,

and a simplified version

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to share any response received from the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy about the essential business definition
- WMABC to share with Metro Vancouver the template provided to haulers describing waste collection as an essential service both the detailed version and the simplified version.
- 8. Driver access to washrooms / handwashing facilities
 - Emterra has fixed bathrooms at Surrey Transfer Station (with running water and soap), and portable toilets (with hand sanitizer) at North Shore Transfer Station. Working to get more portable toilets at all 3 facilities.
 - Haulers trucking waste back and for from contingency disposal locations across the border have their own designated portable toilets
 - Transfer station inspection checklist includes washroom facilities to ensure they are being cleaned and have adequate supplies
 - WMABC provided feedback that hand-washing stations are important, as opposed to just toilets. Suggested portable handwashing stations as an option, with running water and soap
 - Noel Massey has reached out to gas stations and several have agreed to allow his staff to use their washrooms as they are operating as an essential service. They have been very cooperative and understanding.
 - City of Vancouver has a washroom at their transfer station it is open to the public and accessible to drivers

Action Items:

- WMABC (Lori Bryan) will add a question about bathrooms / hand washing facilities to a survey they are issuing to members this week.
- Metro Vancouver to request Emterra to look into portable handwashing stations as an option for Metro Vancouver Transfer Stations. Josh JansenVandorn offered his contact information to assist.
- Metro Vancouver to find out what public washrooms remain open, or can allow collection crews access during this time (regional facilities, municipal facilities, etc). Metro Vancouver will poll municipalities to ask how they are providing washrooms/handwashing facilities to their staff on the road. Metro Vancouver will raise this at REAC on Friday, April 3, 2020.
- City of Vancouver (Albert Shamess) will look into access to washrooms at the City's work yards.
- 9. Hauler PPE & OH&S Practices Update
 - This is a discussion item at REAC-Solid Waste Sub-Committee. Outcomes can be shared with WMABC

10. Updates on any trends on:

• Disposal ban surcharges: No notable trends/changes to date attributable to COVID-19. Top surcharges are cardboard and electronics, as usual.

• Waste flows / loads (Attachment): Waste tonnages and loads are lower than in 2019 at the same time.

- 1. MV Facility Operational Updates
 - Handwashing stations are now in place at Coquitlam, North Shore, and Surrey Transfer Stations
 - Working on resuming collection of clothing and expanded polystyrene at the North Shore and Coquitlam recycling depots
 - WMABC confirmed haulers are still able to collect EPS as normal

- Metro Vancouver to notify WMABC when resume collection of clothing and/or EPS at depots
- 2. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - Implemented some process changes on signing in/out
 - Plexiglass installed at the scale houses
 - Landfill has public washrooms, and transfer station washrooms are available (must ask for key)
- 3. Curbside collection program updates Surrey and Vancouver
 - Surrey: No major operational updates compared to last week. Waste collection crews are offered masks if they choose to wear them. So far haven't had issues accessing PPE supplies.
 - Surrey has noticed a significant spike in organic waste cart orders (double compared to last March), likely driven by yard waste as kraft paper bags are no longer collected. Organics and recycling tonnages appear steady. Garbage pick-up is bi-weekly so this week's data will be a good indicator once it's available.
 - Vancouver: No further updates
- 4. Contingency planning WMABC feedback on proposed operating hours

- Metro Vancouver had proposed core hours of 5:30am-3pm if there is a need to scale back hours in future
- WMABC confirmed that for commercial haulers, earlier is better. However, they have also heard from their members that for residential collection vehicles, 3:00/3:30pm is too early to close as not all residential collection trucks are finished their routes at that time. Also, most vehicles are servicing residential customers at the moment, as many commercial customers have closed.
- City of Vancouver's facilities would likely consider opening for core hours from 5:30am to 3pm if needed, as traffic at their facility tends to decrease significantly in the afternoon.

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to review data showing facility use at different time intervals. WMABC cautioned that some haulers are looking at rerouting, changing start/end times, etc. so the past weeks' data may not be representative of haulers' needs over the coming weeks and months.
- 5. Wait times at Waste-to-Energy Facility data on time spent at facility (Attachment 1)
 - Wait times have returned to normal. Work on the fly ash silo has been completed. Not expecting any further delays moving forward.
 - Currently in the midst of a mini-shutdown at the facility, which should impact direct haul customers (only impacts transfer haul on the back end)
- 6. Access to municipal washrooms
 - Requested this information at the REAC meeting on Friday, April 3
 - Some municipalities do have public washrooms that are open, or that are reopening after a brief closure
 - Metro Vancouver facilities: some washrooms in parks but none are along trucking routes. Will continue to investigate non-Parks washrooms

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to assemble a list of washrooms that are open updates every day or as new information is received from municipalities.
- 7. Requests for tipping fee reductions and payment deferral
 - Metro Vancouver is finalizing a report for the April 15, 2020 Finance and Intergovernment Committee, likely to be posted tomorrow

- Metro Vancouver to forward to WMABC the link to the April 15, 2020 Finance and Intergovernment Committee Agenda once it is published, along with information on how to speak as a delegation
- SuperSave (Josh Jansenvandorn) to forward information to Metro Vancouver about responses received across the country to requests for payment deferrals/reductions.
- 8. Disposal ban surcharges update
 - No significant changes to disposal ban surcharges

- 100 surcharges last week and 125 surcharges this week. Increases were in the two categories, cardboard and electronics.

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to share disposal ban surcharge data with WMABC, comparing current weekly data to average data since implementing the electronic surcharge program. (Continue including this data in weekly meetings going forward)
- 9. Waste flows/loads update (Attachment 2)
 - 15% drop in the last week of march compared to last year in terms of waste in the system
 - Traffic is also down 10-15%
 - Green waste is up a bit this week but was down last week (possibly impacted by weather more residents doing yard work in the sun)

Additional Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to ask EOC if we have a source for PPE / masks that we can share with WMABC.
- Vancouver to also look into sources of face masks
- Metro Vancouver to look at the tonnage split between single family waste and all commercial (which includes multi-family)
- Reschedule next week's meeting as Finance and Intergovernment Committee is 1-4pm. Suggest same day at 12noon, or move it to the following day.

- 1. MV Facility Operational Updates
 - Residential EPS collection has resumed at recycling depots at North Shore and Coquitlam Transfer Stations (Recycle BC has resumed their service with Green By Nature)
 - Books and textiles collection at the recycling depots has also been restored
 - Operating as normal at Metro Vancouver Transfer Stations

Action Item (not related to the meeting but to include in follow-up email to WMABC):

- Carpet is temporarily no longer accepted at Coquitlam Transfer Station as the processor has closed
- 2. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - Steady residential and small commercial traffic over the long weekend
 - Still not accepting clothing for donation for now will monitor now that Metro Vancouver has resumed acceptance
 - Resuming acceptance of EPS on Monday, April 20 with Recycle BC
- 3. Curbside collection program updates Surrey and Vancouver
 - None
- 4. Contingency planning Operating hours: review of facility use over time of day (Attachment 1)
 - Data shows there is a need for service at the beginning and end of the day, particularly commercial vehicles at beginning of day and municipal vehicles near the end of the day
 - If needed, could start by reducing hours for non-account customers (e.g. 10-3 for non account customers) and maintain hours for account customers by running only the unattended scales. This would reduce staffing requirements at the beginning and end of the day.

- Vancouver mentioned we reduced hours for non-account customers, there would be a need to monitor illegal dumping as a potential unattended consequence

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to send WMABC the proposed contingency plan for reducing hours if needed: start by reducing hours for non-account customers and maintaining normal hours for account customers using the unattended scales at the beginning and end of the day.
- Municipal washrooms Map (https://www.google.com/maps/d/viewer?mid=1etEqj6AJ0OeNKgf7Ep5QXmNQRFxOesb9&usp=sharing)
 - Maria Lo demonstrated the washroom map on a computer and on a mobile phone
 - Some of the washrooms are not accessible to large trucks
 - Users can provide feedback if they are on the road and find that a listed washroom is closed
 - Will be shared with REAC and REAC-Solid Waste Sub-Committee
 - Positive feedback from WMABC

Action Item:

- WMABC to provide feedback on anyone else who should be notified about this map. WMABC suggested delivery companies.
- 6. Waste-to-Energy Facility Turnaround Times (Attachment 2)
 - Spike on Monday due to issue with a transfer trailer
 - Coordinating with Emterra to ensure transfer trailers are spaced out to keep wait times down
 - Operational shut-downs and maintenance work have been completed do not anticipate any more site interruptions in the near future

Action Item:

- Metro Vancouver to continue to report on Waste-to-Energy Facility Turnaround Times each week
- 7. Disposal ban surcharges update (Attachment 3)
 - Disposal Ban Surcharge Data available to view
 - Not just commercial it's all traffic
 - Includes all loads, but should primarily be commercial loads because residential customers will often pull out the banned material from their load to avoid a surcharge.

- Metro Vancouver to provide disposal ban data for just commercial loads, so that WMABC can communicate to haulers about any items with higher commercial surcharge levels
- 8. Waste flows/loads update
 - a. Daily and Weekly Waste Flows/Loads (Attachment 4)
 - Waste flows are down, but transactions are up, especially for green waste

- This is consistent with our observation of an increase in smaller vehicles, and decrease in total tonnage similar to Vancouver's observations
- WMABC request just commercial waste flows we are still working on this data (see item (b) below)
- b. Single-Family and Commercial Tonnage Split in progress
- To be sent by next meeting

Other items:

- WMABC asked if they've seen an increase in illegal dumping:
 - \circ $\,$ Some data was posted to REAC-SWSC SharePoint yesterday.
 - So far no indication on new illegal dumping trends based on data collected from municipalities, although we are continuing to monitor especially as many large item pickup programs have been suspended
 - Diabetes association stopped servicing clothing bins and left bins there have been some concerns with debris left by the bins
 - Lots of PPE observed littered in parking lots, especially outside grocery stores
 - Commercial customers are doing a good job at bagging PPE material in the garbage (feedback from Waste Management)

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to share municipal data on illegal dumping at next week's meeting with WMABC, and with PREOC
- WMABC will ask whether their members have noticed garbage left at customers' sites.
 Immediate feedback was that Waste Management and SuperSave have not noticed much dumping by garbage bins.
- Vancouver to provide a report/update from their street inspectors on any changes/observations around commercial garbage bins.

 - Resumed sales of compost at NSTS
- 2. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - Started Styrofoam as of April 20
 - Opened compost facility back for commercial customers to buy compost. Will monitor to see how it plays out for residential folks but currently no residential transactions allowed
 - After switching to no cash, had complaints initially but it's tapered off in the last couple weeks
 - No changes to operation hours so far. Fully staffed and business as usual
- 3. Curbside collection program updates Surrey and Vancouver
 - Status quo
 - Still not collecting extra waste or LIPU will discuss with contractor when/how they might resume that in the future
 - 30% increase in organic waste. Initially thought it would decrease after they stopped collecting excess material, but it hasn't stopped. It's a good thing in that the extra material isn't being placed in the garbage
 - The excess is mostly yard waste. Residents are using neighbours carts to fill everything up if needed. Lots of people upsizing their carts as well.
 - Surrey biofuel operating as normal
 - Illegal dumping has decreased (surprising as the LIPU program has been suspended)
 - o Asking for small vehicle data going to STS compared to last year

- Paul said: we no longer have data by municipality of origin anymore, but we can look at STS and see what's happening at that facility and provide that data to you. Let's do it for ALL the transfer stations we can show at REAC-SWSC and WMABC as well. Weekly data on all the facilities separately.
- 4. Illegal Dumping
 - a. Municipal illegal dumping data (Attachment 1)
 - Next week show the charts from Adriana's ppt presentation that show a decrease compared to last year. The message is that there is a decrease – Adriana or Maria can present the data
 - b. City of Vancouver street inspectors update
 - Anecdotal: more in downtown / downtown east side; otherwise mostly business as normal
 - No stats on whether ticketing has increased or not. It's a matter of whether they can even find someone to communicate with who operates the bins. Some bins are just abandoned because the businesses aren't running right now
 - c. Metro Vancouver PPE littering graphic (Attachment 2)
 - Share the graphics in a useable form in case the members are able to use the ad. Can be rebranded, although we leave our logo and remove our tag-line
 - MV to send to Lori and she can distribute it to members
- 5. Waste-to-Energy Facility Turnaround Times (Attachment 3)
 - Chart shows 1-hr wait times
 - David Millman said staff said Friday was 1.5 hr wait
 - Long wait times
 - Long wait times before you get to the scales
 - Increase in number of transactions at transfer stations (small vehicles), but at the WTEF it's only commercial and commercial tonnage is down
 - There is more transfer loads coming to WTEF
 - Metro Vancouver Will investigate further to see why there are such long wait times despite reduction in tonnage looking at data and cameras to monitor the situation report back
 - Working with emterra to move more of the transfer loads outside of the busy hours during the day
 - Discussion on whether hospital loads can go back to the VLF rather than all being redirected to the WTEF
 - Action: City of Vancouver to get back to group by early next week on this discussion on whether VLF can accept hospital waste (significant amounts – 10,000t per year, ~1,000 loads/yr – probably more now with all the additional PPE being used)
 - Noel Massey said: care home waste has gone up, picking up daily now. Is there any concern with that at the landfill? We're maintaining safety of collection crews by requiring it's all contained.

- Front load bins
- In general it's fine except for biowaste and hazardous waste should be separating their waste as per normal
- MV facilities are not getting reports of noticeable quantities of un-bagged items
- David Millman and Noel Massey: everyone's been really diligent about bagging. Haven't noticed many issues. They understand that must be bagged and contained in bins or it's not being picked up
- Action item: share across the region through Vancouver coastal Vancouver's message on binners getting on contain (message to care homes forwarded from City of Vancouver?
- If yellow bags arrive, they need to be pulled out if at TSs, but at WTEF it's not possible to do that at all. They note it and put it into the feed chute. Incidents are traced back to health authority and communicated back to the facility. Figure out where the material came from to see if it needs to be tried to removed or now. Hard to know whether it's biomedical waste or if it was just the wrong bag used, but operate under assumption that it's hazardous
- 6. Disposal ban surcharges (Attachment 4) commercial load split to come next week
 - WMABC will provide feedback on the disposal ban report once Lori has circulated and they have a chance to discuss together
 - The report gets published in 2 weeks please provide feedback soon
 - Can we focus the data on the multi-family? no we can't delineate it. We can get commercial and residential by next week, but don't have a way to separate multi-family from the rest of commercial
 - David Millman was asking because they have the most control to communicate, because maybe the households aren't as good at separating as the commercial businesses that are now closed
 - Chris will check with Brandon with on-the-ground observation
 - Also check with Recycle BC to see if they're also seeing an increase in cardboard maybe provide more corrugated cardboard containers?
 - MV will check with Andrew Doi to see if we have any RecycleBC data available. There was a REAC-SWSC action item to request RecycleBC data. Volume information (not weight), such as increased number of loads or cubic metres. Challenging because as of May 19 they are moving to a new processor
- 7. Waste flows/loads update
 - a. Daily and Weekly Waste Flows/Loads, including Single-Family/Commercial Split (Attachment 5)
 - How is the SF data pulled it includes the contractors that are hauled by haulers it's all the direct billed material that is billed directly back to munis, including munis that do ther own collection with their own crews. Even maple ridge is in there because it's tagged at the STS as single family curbside. Couple minor exceptions but it's very representative.

• City of north van combines with ops material but it's super minor





The following is a message sent to long-term care facilities from the City of Vancouver.

Guidelines for disposal and management of waste at long-term care facilities

To help prevent the spread of COVID-19, and to protect both waste collection workers and our most vulnerable populations, long term care facility staff are asked to follow these guidelines:

Guidelines for proper waste disposal

- All general waste materials must be placed in plastic garbage bags, tied securely and then put in the garbage container for collection. No loose or un-bagged garbage.
- All personal hygiene waste (used tissues, gloves, masks, wipes) must be double-bagged before being placed in the garbage container.
- All waste materials that have been or may have been exposed to the COVID-19 virus must be double-bagged before being placed in the garbage container.
- NO biomedical waste of any kind should be placed in the regular garbage.
- NO garbage of any kind should be mixed with recyclable materials.

Guidelines for proper management of Containers

Waste and recycling containers stored outside must be closed and locked at all times (except when in direct use or when being emptied.)

Locked containers prevent access by transients, the homeless and binners. Unlocked containers are an invitation to our most vulnerable members to dig into them looking for returnable containers or other items of value. Anyone digging into the bin could be at risk of coming into contact with the COVID-19 virus.

- 5. Waste-to-Energy Facility Turnaround Times (Attachment 3)
 - Waste-to-Energy Facility still experiencing some line-ups
 - Confirmed there are now no transfer hauls arriving between 10am and 3pm, which helps manage line-ups.
 - Hospital waste continues to be a contributing factor to wait times.
 - A 3rd door is available but currently needs to be manually opened

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to investigate how to further reduce line-ups at the Waste-to-Energy Facility, including the availability and accessibility of the 3rd door.
- 6. Hospital and Care Home Waste
 - a. City of Vancouver's message to care homes (Attachment 4)
 - Confirmed that Vancouver Coastal Health is also communicating with care homes on proper disposal of care home waste including personal protective equipment
 - b. Update on hospital waste disposal City of Vancouver and Metro Vancouver
 - Vancouver to provide update on engagement with safety committee on resuming receipt of hospital waste at North Shore and Coquitlam Transfer Station

7. Disposal bans

- a. Disposal ban surcharge data and on-the-ground observations (Attachment 5)
 - No indication of any major anomalies in the surcharge data
 - Commercial data is now provided
- b. WMABC's feedback on format of Zero Waste Committee disposal ban report
 - WMABC expressed two main themes:
 - Address banned materials at the generator level.
 - Metro Vancouver mentioned the e-surcharge program increases transparency of the disposal ban program. In addition, a project is underway to explore what additional technological tools can be utilized to identify banned materials at the source
 - Explore how to remove surcharged recyclable materials after the items have been dropped off at a solid waste facility.
 - Metro Vancouver Vancouver mentioned that with the New Coquitlam Transfer Station, there will be a 65,000 sq ft flat floor which may offer more flexibility and opportunities to cone off loads and remove recyclables. Will revisit and discuss when the new facility is operational.
 - WMABC expressed that announcing haulers that have been surcharged reflects poorly on these companies, where the banned materials were placed in the waste by the generator
 - Metro Vancouver explained that this data is not considered confidential and it must be published. It is included alphabetically in an appendix in the annual report.

- Confirmation that a year-to-year surcharge comparison list by-hauler will not be published *Action Items:* (Not to share to Vancouver and Surrey, as they weren't part of this discussion?)

- Within the next few days in advance of publishing the May Zero Waste Committee agenda, Metro Vancouver to individually send surcharge data to the companies that had the top 10 highest number of surcharges in 2019. This would include surcharge total, surcharge rate, and full list of surcharges for the year, and the last 2 years' summary data for that particular company. The historic data will not be published in the report. If there are challenges with the timing of providing the data to waste management companies or with the accuracy of the data, Metro Vancouver could defer the disposal ban report to the June Zero Waste Committee meeting -- After meeting note: the information will be sent to individual haulers during the week of May 4th, and the report is being moved to June.
- Metro Vancouver to bring a presentation to a future WMABC meeting on a current project exploring explore technological tools to identify banned materials at the source.
- At a later date, for example once the new Coquitlam Transfer Station is operational: Metro Vancouver to further discuss with WMABC opportunities to remove surcharged recyclables from the waste stream.
- Metro Vancouver to provide link to disposal ban web page, where haulers can find resources such as the Disposal Ban Program Manual, Disposal bans letter, and information cards. -http://www.metrovancouver.org/services/solid-waste/recycling-programs/disposalban/Pages/default.aspx







Metro Vancouver Disposal Ban Surcharges





- Metro Vancouver to work with City of Vancouver to coordinate the launch of new account verification process across regional solid waste facilities.
- b. Waste-to-Energy Facility Turnaround Times (Attachment 1)
 - Data shows improvement to turnaround times at the Waste-to-Energy Facility
 - Continuing to work on solutions to ensure turnaround times are reasonable and manageable
 - 3rd door needs to be manually opened, and when it's opened it obstructs operation of the crane. Perhaps not the ideal solution.
 - Waste-to-Energy Facility spring shut-down has been delayed to mid-July. Impacts to direct haul will be minimal. There will be a brief outage period that will be communicated to account customers.

Action Item:

- Metro Vancouver will continue to monitor and work on solutions to minimize turnaround times at the Waste-to-Energy Facility
- c. Disposal ban surcharge data and on-the-ground observations (Attachment 2)
 - Electronics surcharges appear consistently higher than previously. Besides that, no evidence of

- major impacts to surcharges due to COVID-19.
- Speculation: higher electronics surcharges could be related to residents avoiding trips to the recycling depot, or related to the closure of return-to-retail options such as Staples and London Drugs
- WMABC has heard that batteries (e.g. laptops, cell phones) have been becoming more of an issue in the waste stream

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver to share disposal ban data with EPR programs and inquire about their response to return-to-retail options being closed, especially for hazardous materials, electronics, and batteries.
- d. Waste flows (Attachment 3)
 - Some discussion on the bi-weekly fluctuation in waste flows for single-family curbside waste related to biweekly collection of garbage across municipalities
 - Waste Management is being contacted by many businesses about resuming service following May 15th, with the BC reopening plan. It will be good to monitor waste flows to wee how closely they line up with the milestones announced by the province.
 - City of Vancouver reported seeing approx. 20% higher garbage and 10% higher organics compared to business as usual.
- e. Other:
 - North Shore Transfer Station compactor maintenance starting tonight (May 8, 2020, until May 16, 2020
 - Compactor will be out of service during maintenance so we will be top-loading, which may impact traffic slightly. There may also be brief interruptions to traffic flow if moving equipment around. This is an ideal time for maintenance as overall tonnage is down so there is less garbage to top-load during maintenance of compactor
 - Metro Vancouver will send real-time notifications via text message if more significant delays occur (not anticipated)
- 2. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - a. Hospital and Care Home Waste disposal update
 - Starting Monday, hospital waste will be delivered to Vancouver Landfill via North Shore Transfer Station
 - b. Request regarding deferral of interest rates and bin licensing
 - Requests were not approved
 - WMABC to follow up with a letter to City Manager or Mayor of Vancouver re: bin licensing and interest deferral request.
 - c. Discussion on Litter and abandoned waste
 - Vancouver has seen increase in litter in specific locations within the city, as well as increased incidences of abandoned waste. PPE littering is relatively well managed, and it seems the early communication on proper disposal of PPE has helped
- 3. Curbside collection program updates Surrey and Vancouver

- City of Surrey is resuming excess collection of garbage, recycling and organics as of Monday, May 11 (material beyond what is collected in the carts)
- Large item pick-up is resuming May 19
- City of Surrey will be promoting the restart of services through social media, website, waste app, and hotline
- Pop-up junk events likely not happening this year. Possibility to run reduced version of the events but nothing has been finalized or announced
- 4. 2019 Disposal Ban Program: Zero Waste Committee Report
 - Report has been moved to the June 17, 2020 Zero Waste Committee meeting
 - Metro Vancouver will send out the disposal ban surcharge information to the top 10 surcharged entities including the list of all their own surcharges received in 2019.

Action Item:

 Metro Vancouver to provide link to the May 15, 2020 Zero Waste Committee agenda once it's published, along with instructions for watching the meeting via live stream and options available for attending in person to observe.

 - Metro Vancouver confirmed it is possible to change the account verification requirement to inputting vehicle licence plate, rather than requiring driver's signature, to minimize contact between drivers and scale attendants

 - Metro Vancouver to confirm by the end of next week re: the change from driver's signature to vehicle licence plate to verify accounts at the attended scale. If the change is made, a notification will be sent to all account customers.
 - b. Waste-to-Energy Facility Turnaround Times (Attachment 1)
 - There was a brief shut-down at the facility today, due to both cranes breaking down and requiring maintenance SMS message was sent, noting when the facility closed and when it reopened an hour later.

Action Items:

- David Millman will check with his staff to ensure they have SMS notifications set up
- WMABC to communicate the importance and value of SMS notifications to their members once again, early next week, and include a screenshot of the message that was received today
- c. Disposal ban surcharge data and EPR update (electronics, batteries) (Attachment 2)
 - No new trends
 - WMABC inquired whether Metro Vancouver expects changes in waste flows as BC reopens.

- RE: Following up with EPR programs about electronics
 - Most electronics and batteries are collected via depots rather than return-to retail, except London Drugs. Best Buy phased out of collection a few years ago.
 - Household batteries are collected by retailers but anything attached to electronics are usually depots
 - Most household battery collection points are closed, including return-to-retail and civic facilities. But Encorp and municipal depots still accept them. As household batteries are small they are easier to stockpile during the pandemic
 - EPR programs received notes from customers about the following deterrents to visiting a recycling depot, which may be contributing to recyclable materials in the garbage:
 - Lineups at transfer stations and landfills and depots due to more people doing spring cleaning during the quarantine and physical distancing requirements at facilities
 - Residents not feeling comfortable going out to recycling depots

Action Items:

- Metro Vancouver (Andrew Doi and Sarah Evanetz) to discuss options with EPR programs on communicating importance of proper recycling of electronics and batteries.
- WMABC (Lori Bryan) to discuss with the WMABC Board on possibility to work with Metro Vancouver and EPR programs on some co-branded messaging about keeping electronics and batteries out of the garbage.
- d. Waste flows (Attachment 3)
 - Garbage tonnages starting to rise again
 - Next week we may see commercial tonnage slowly coming back as businesses reopen
 - By-facility tonnages are also normalizing. Waste flows at large transfer stations are coming back up, and at small transfer stations going back down, towards the normal range
- e. Survey: Assessment of Solid Waste System
 - Reach out to account customers to reach out about experiences and hopes w.r.t solid waste system, including a question about the tipping fee structure. This survey is part of our assessment of the solid waste system to support the long term solid waste management planning process
 - Survey will be sent out to account customers and municipalities next week.

Action Item:

- Metro Vancouver to send a copy of the solid waste system survey to Lori Bryan directly
- f. Hospital waste:
 - Resumed accepting hospital waste at North Shore and Coquitlam Transfer Station. A few challenges initially including reassuring staff, and dealing with a load that triggered radiation detectors (not unusual for medical waste)

metrovancouver

- Business as usual moving forward.
- No issues at the Vancouver Landfill with respect to receiving mixed loads including hospital waste from North Shore and Coquitlam Transfer Stations.
- No comment from WMABC other than thanks and acknowledgement
- g. Compactor at NSTS coming back on line after the weekend. Didn't see a large impact to wait times, especially with the lower tonnages right now. Some period of longer wait times, including a bulge in traffic towards the end of the day or random surges during the day, mostly driven by members of the public in small vehicles.
- 2. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - Single lane alternating traffic -- Paving all around the scales and residential drop off area, done in phases to keep the site open
 - Already has been communicated to haulers through Lori
 - Will have more clarity on dates of impact closer to May 27th
 - About to trial unattended scales at the landfill
 - Test rfid tags on MV trucks. Test on Tuesday and Wednesday.
 - Will try more after the paving is complete, then get some haulers on the programs to start who have consistent material type. So at the unattended scale you'd only enter the origin of waste
 - Discussion about physical printed tickets v.s. emailed receipts at all regional solid waste facilities
 - Feedback from David Millman: for larger commercial haulers, electronic makes sense. There may be some smaller haulers that prefer a physical printed ticket.

Action Item:

- Metro Vancouver to explore possibility of introducing an electronic ticket option at solid waste facilities, while maintaining the physical printed ticket as an option for those who prefer it.
- 3. Curbside collection program updates Surrey and Vancouver
 - No updates from Surrey or Vancouver
- 4. Lori Bryan questions:
 - Additional toilets and hand washing stations is there a long term plan to keep them? Are we
 monitoring how well they're used?:
 - Reports say they're not heavily used so as the pressure for facilities is reduced, we'd go back to offering our standard facilities. But we would watch the demand.
 - Metro Vancouver doesn't expect to remove the hand washing stations at least throughout the summer
 - Noel Massey noted they have seen an increase in open gas station washrooms in Surrey. They have been very accommodating to drivers
 - The Metro Vancouver washroom map is now over 20,000 views

metrovancouver

- It will be put on the MV website later today so more secure
- Lori: PREOC and Worksafe BC were really interested in the washroom map
- Each of our contractors have plans in place to respond to COVID. In the event of an infection among staff, the heath authority would make a decision on whether there is a risk to others and who needs to be notified.
- Any feedback on new protocols that have been put in place? (e.g. distancing, no cash, etc)
 - Have received some comments about someone being too close to me, but quite rare.
 - Some people have called in to say they were impressed with how everything was delineated
 - Generally people are happy with the protocols. Some have complained about line-ups, and occasionally people feel someone got too close to them.
 - Recycling depots have been the most challenging due to increased use and potential line-ups. Strengthened up our camera program around that. CTS is about to be brought online at both the depot and transfer station to view traffic/line-ups. Also physical distancing is harder in the depot as people are walking around to different bins.
 - City of Vancouver: haven't heard anything negative. We have more space at landfill so less of concern. Doing some taping to facilitate physical distancing at the Zero Waste Centre where there is less room to move around.

 - Collection side: 10% higher residential waste compared to last year. Green bin waste is back down to similar to last year.
 - Vancouver has had media inquiries about masks/gloves but messaging is consistent that we see it but it's not major in the litter side. Another social media blast might be good as it's becoming a hot topic again. People are relaxing their efforts so good to reinforce.
 - Discussion on wipes being flushed down the toilet an increasing issue as more people are using wipes

Action Item:

- Metro Vancouver (Sarah Evanetz) to discuss with Metro Vancouver External Relations team and Doug Thomas at City of Vancouver about the opportunity to expand on the PPE disposal message. Beyond just communicating that PPE goes in the garbage rather than littered on the streets, could enforce the message that items such as wipes should not be placed in the compost or flushed down the toilet. Metro Vancouver will share with WMABC any messaging that we post on this topic.
- 3. Curbside collection program updates Surrey and Vancouver
- 4. Question from WMABC:
 - Virus transmission at our facilities any information
 - o No issues with staff at our facilities having covid
 - o Sites remain safe and so far no issues at all
 - o WMABC has heard similar from private facilities. Managed to keep any infections at

bay

- Within MV there was 1-2 cases among staff, but the ones that have occurred the transmission was not work related. No transmission on-the-job.
- No cases among our contractors.
- Vancouver: in the initial stages there were people isolating, but havn't seen any cases at the facilities or collection crews. Took steps right away to limit risks to staff so that went a long way in preventing infections.
- <u>Hand washing stations</u>: being used, but not heavily used. No plans to remove them just yet.
 - Our washroom map is still being used but the number of views has gone down (previously 10,000 per week). Cumulative total of approx 40,000 views. Washrooms have been opening up so there is less demand. More people also know now where the washrooms are on their routes
- 5. Facility naming
 - Naming the two new facilities, and also reviewing the current facilities on facility type name
 - Surveyed REAC-SW and REAC, and in two weeks is RAAC, the goal is to get to the Board in September with recommended names
 - Also surveying municipal staff, some in solid waste and some not, through online survey.

Action Items:

- After June 25, Metro Vancouver will send out a survey to account customers on facility naming. WMABC agreed they can distribute it to members also. Consider offering prizes for participating in the survey.


Weekly Total Tonnage - 2019 vs. 2020 Garbage - System MSW






















Weekly Total Tonnage Comparison - 2019 vs 2020* Garbage - CTS




Weekly Total Tonnage Comparison - 2019 vs 2020* Garbage - NSTS




Weekly Total Tonnage Comparison - 2019 vs 2020* Garbage - STS

 - Noel wants us to do something similar with electronics as we've done with the bag it bin it communications – Sarah said it was mostly a social media based campaign but it got earned media where it got picked up by local news so that's why it was super effective. Might look to a similar approach.

- c. Waste flows including Metro Vancouver and City of Vancouver facility data (Attachment 3)
 - Seeing a difference between VSTS and the MV facilities (even with landfill removed) but why

is the VSTS so much of a bigger impact (20% reduction from 2019)

- Maybe because the businesses/restaurants make a big part of the Vancouver network so may not generate as much garbage, or tie in to a coquitlam or surrey truck route and go to the other facilities. Maybe just that the downtown core is more impacted than the rest of the region.
- Noel maple ridge wants to know going into august/sept whether the 1 hour difference will come back the 1 hour difference is making a huge difference for them maple ridge/coq/poco area is breaking records in the amount of waste everyone is just home more. We never went to summer hours as usual on April 1 Chris and Paul will talk about this.

Action Item:

- Metro Vancouver to revisit the possibility of reinstating summer hours at transfer stations.
 - Non-account customers up 12% last week which is a lot more than bef
 - The graph is looking at garbage only (not other streams)
 - Yard trimmings too seasonal so not good indicator of covid impacts
 - •
- 2. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - Definitely see a waste decrease coming into VSTS
 - Organics/yard trimmings continuing to be substantially higher than normal. 250-400tonnes/day. Bit of a surprise for us. 12-15% higher than usual.
 - Increase in non-account customers/residents coming in, but tonnage is down
 - Zero waste centre continue to see 550-700customers/day. Increased over the past month as more people are getting out and about
 - Issuing an RFP to restart collection of textiles aim to start collecting by around September 1 at zero waste centre and the landfill
 - Starting to look at how to safely resume acceptance of cash will update when we start taking cash again
 - Look at starting to accept new pieces of drywall again safety procedures hope to be up and running in next couple of weeks
 - Staying open mon-weds for emterra to go to wtef. Outside of that, no other updates
 - Completed paving at the landfill so should be less interruptions to vehicles coming on site right now
 - Automated scales we're about 90% there. Got some issues with rfid readers at landfill and same issues at VSTS due to different sizes/windows on trucks. IT team was pulled off the project 2 weeks ago so trying to get someone back in to finalize. Hopefuly get kinks worked out in next month. Starting with MV trucks coming to landfill and sanitation trucks coming into the transfer station.
 - Lineups at VSTS: hit and miss. Hired a consultant to do a traffic study. Working on couple of operational updates to help with mitigating traffic extending some lanes and work like that.
 - Still have lineup issues at zero waste centre due to physical distancing (using every 2nd

stall instead of every stall)

 - Outages: Grant Hankins asking about whether we track reason for the service interruptions
 - o SMS is only sent for unexpected closures. Planned closures are sent via email
 - Do we report it in the annual report? yes we publish interruptions along with causes
 - We have the information and the data around the root cause. But that doesn't always tie to hauler availability. Plant availability is just operational hours. But almost always available to haulers even if a boiler is down for example
 - We're not reporting out specifically on when the facility isn't available to haulers.
 - PH: we should report BOTH maintenance incidences (as we do now), and also report out availability of the facility to users at WTEF AND our transfer stations (Jerry asked us to start reporting this), as well as drivers for that availability. Start with the WTEF.
 - Noel is talking about Surrey Transfer Station not being safe for trucks. Pit is so full that there is
 insufficient room for the trucks to go in safely to dump the load safely, causing truck damage.
 Requesting more accountability and reporting on not being able to safely accept more loads if
 that is the case.
 - Paul: we do track inventory every day how much waste is in the transfer station.
 Track it every day. We do work closely with emterra to keep it well managed.
 - Noel wants an alert sent out when the facilities are backed up etc. including at the transfer stations can then message our guys and delay sending them there.
 - We will find out what we can do to improve the situation and/or the communication of these scenarios
 - b. Disposal ban surcharge data (Attachment 2)
 - Similar trends to before.

- Electronics still a bit high
- Noel: heavier black bags usually have a surprise in there that the customer is hiding
- Dave: some haulers out there are throwing everything in one bin. How is that impacting the customers.
 - PH: we've anecdotally been out in the community looking at services provided and for the most part seeing (anecdotally) that most places have full set of bins
 - Working on a study with consultant to see what's visible w.r.t. services provided
- c. Waste flows (Attachment 3)
 - Waste flow similar or up a bit
 - Vancouver system remains down 30ish percent from last year
 - Vancouver transfer station has leveled off but the VLF still... residuals from C&D facilities aren't coming to the VLF in 2020 compared to 2019. Not impacted by residential/commercial
 - [had to leave to tend to evelyn]
 - Action: post the process of receiving out-of-region waste somewhere on our website and include the higher rate information, application process, and rules
 - Extended hours: North shore is getting virtually no use after 5pm; Coquitlam is used after 5 but we do keep 6pm all the time anyway. Perhaps look into keeping 6pm for Surrey transfer station only, for an extra month beyond our usual summer hours....so keep summer hours to the end of October M-F closing at 6pm (wouldn't extend the Saturday summer hours)
 - Lori will let Noel know that's what we're thinking and MV will confirm within the next week.
 - What we see is the traffic drops off once it becomes dark after 5pm.
 - Coquitlam is good because many of the companies are based there so they dump as they're coming in to their company headquarters
 - MV will keep monitoring and revisit if there seems to still be lots of use of the extra hour throughout October
 - Lori: haulers are noticing record-level residential curbside waste and recycling pick-up
- 2. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - Lynn had an update and I totally missed it. Something about a text thing? In process?
 - \circ ~ I think it was looking at accepting cash at COV faciltiies.
 - At transfer station -- RFID issues not reading the tag a lot of time; gate not going up 20 percent of the time also. Start with our own transfer trucks. Once we iron out the kinks do it at VLF now... and could open up to commercial trucks that are consistent on material type.

 - Market sounding previously was reported out to ZWC. Whether we receive commercial organics at transfer stations

- Plan to start engagement this fall, checking in with whether what we heard in the market sounding is accurate. And if we delivered the service, how could it work.
- Primary question: is WMABC interested in engagement specific to their members? To do direct engagement if that's an interest.
- Lori will bring it up to the board and get back to us.
- We have some options, looking for feedback around those options. That will all be considered as we go to the Board with a recommendation.

Hand washing stations: question from Lori whether we're keeping them

- No plans to remove them yet
- They are getting good use.
- Chris to check whether the handwashing stations freeze if it gets cold. Are there other options that work better in the winter? We need to figure out a way to do it in winter.
 - Lori said portapotties have issue with hand sanitizer being stolen, so having a hard time replacing that. Would suggest sanitizer in winger but depends on the availability of the stuff at that time
 - There are still gas stations that don't want folks using their washrooms, and as cases rise who knows.
 - Over 20,000 views for our washroom map there's def a real need for publicly accessible washroom.

GFL Fire:

- Municipal level: service has continued normally and the depots are operating as normal
- Any feedback from Haulers?
- Lori: fire was only on product in the yard. Not their building or infrastructure. Had some backups to be able to stay open. Haven't seen any service interruption.

Next Meeting: To be confirmed – in approximately 1 month – early October – will propose a date offline

Summary of Action Items:

- Will confirm the possibility of maintaining the 6pm closing time at Surrey Transfer Station on Weekdays, until the end of October. Will continue monitoring the use of the facility past 5pm in October. Put on our website at the same time as posting the monthly waste flows. "Surrey Transfer Station will be open until 6:00pm, Monday-Friday until October 30, 2020." – then email Lori to let her know
- MV will investigate what could be done to improve operations and/or communications in scenarios where transfer station waste inventory is impacting hauler/user experience and potentially safety. Specifically the Surrey Transfer Station. – Answer is that we need to either

be open or closed. Facility operator needs to ensure the facility is fully safe if we are open. If there is an unexpected closure for any reason, then yes we would issue notifications.

- Will begin reporting out on the availability of the Waste-to-Energy Facility to users. In near future also will look at reporting on facility availability at Metro Vancouver transfer stations
- Handwashing stations Chris to talk to operations team and Emterra to discuss how to maintain this service into the winter. Possible adaptations required.










































Weigh Scale System Upgrade Potential Functionality Improvements

- 1. Automated license plate recognition for both attended and non-attended scales supporting the elimination of signature pads.
- 2. Potential for use of phones instead of cards for unattended scales (using QR codes).

 - Another hauler has been hired to help with trucking side. Were issues with availability on trucking side. either mechanical difficulties or not enough drivers / drivers calling in sick
 - Also added a new machine at Surrey. Will work over the weekend and next week to try to get the inventory gone
 - <u>Noel</u>: that still doesn't help day to day operations as we don't know those answers. We made a call to STS when my first driver got stuck in the lineup. After the scale he waited 45 mins, on Tuesday. Then had to turn my guys around and said don't go into the line. The line-up camera doesn't tell me there's a major problem inside the facility.
 - <u>MV: If facilities aren't safe we need to shut them down</u> we're either operational or not. We won't say "facility is open but don't come here".
 - <u>Lori's suggestion</u>: maybe an alert that there is a delay at a certain facility, for 45min or 1 hr etc, so maybe haulers can reroute their guys or take their lunch at that time, etc.

- <u>MV will discuss internally</u> on how this is possible and how transient the current conditions are and if a text notice would work.
- Will look at if there are situations where there's no visible line up but there is still delay at the facility.
- We were at one point hoping to get a system where we report on wait times at all times, but it's not as predictable as say the border... because there are different queue lanes, unloading times, different material categories you're dropping off, etc.

- c. Handwashing stations
 - Portable toilets remaining; ensure handwashing will remain through the winter until the spring, then reevaluate.
 - Relatively low cost service to provide and are well used currently
- d. Waste-to-Energy Facility Availability Report
 - We didn't provide an update on this?

- e. Waste-to-Energy Facility Turnaround Times (Attachment 2)
 - No planned maintenance until April, at this point.

Attached is the monthly disposal ban program data from January to September. The inspection and surcharge rates are consistent with the previous weekly reports. Surcharges on oversize object is higher with mostly wooden pellets identified at the WTEF. There appears to be an increasing trend in the number of commercial surcharges issued for food waste, gypsum, mixed recyclable materials, oversized object, and rope & cable over 1m in the last three months compared to the first six months of this year.

- Oversized object is anything over the 1.5m restriction at TS and 1m restriction at WTEF

 - Attempt to ensure there is no impact to haulers, but drivers may notice that it looks like a lot of waste is building up on one end of the building

- Grant Hankins: communication has been sent out on 2021 tip fees but feedback was that the communication was not necessarily telling the whole story about the rate increase
 - Asking MV to look at this document says rates will increase \$4/tonne which is true, but "on an average of 3%" is accurate for unit rate, but the max load fee goes up to 7% difference (for under 1 tonne loads). The \$99/tonne rate, it's a 4% increase, but the max load fee goes up for smaller loads.
 - MV will have a look and get back to WMABC. The large loads are slightly more than 4% increase
- 7. Payment Deferral Program
 - Met on Friday to go through how it will work mechanically
 - Board approved payment deferral mechanism to 90days til the end of 2020, giving haulers 6 months to catch up on the deferrals.
 - Working on communication to haulers on that implementation
 - Will go from 90 days to 30 days for January invoice.
 - Then, it's March when the 6month payback period would start.
 - Half our customers are paying based on 90days now. So as of January 1 they would pay on 30days
 - Start catching up in March payback period would start so it's 2 months of outstanding invoices paid off over 6 months. No interest charged over the 6 months.
 - Probably send the notice early next week.
 - Will ask folks if they want to take advantage of the 6 month window will work out a monthly payment over 6 mos to pay off the 2 mos of outstanding invoices. (if not, the whole thing is due March)

 - Effective date of any changes would be for 2022
 - b. Waste-to-Energy Facility Turnaround Times (Attachment 1)
 - Scale maintenance work for a couple of hours the other week
 - .
 - c. Disposal ban surcharge data and monthly report template (Attachment 2)
 - October v.s. November, the monthly total went down, , electronics down a little bit as well compared to the peak of 200-250 surcharges on electronics. Others have gone down as well.
 - Follow-up on mixed recycling went from 3 surcharges in January to ~ 30 now what happened
 - Municipal illegal dumping data haven't shared it recently. We can follow up next meeting.
 - Especially look at gypsum?
 - One challenge is the consistency in reporting.
 - Vancouver tracks it closely. Def see C&D waste that contains drywall (as opposed to dedicated loads of dumped just-drywall).
 - Vancouver able to take a couple cases to court on fining for illegal dumping. Biggest one was \$2,500 not really high but it is something. An enforcement mechanism

- Vancouver put cameras up in a few places; privacy assessments for each camera before installing. Then people found ways to do it without being seen by camera
- Bulky item pickup programs work really well. Surrey does pop-up junk days.
- d. Waste flows (Attachment 3)
 - Our system has mostly stabilized
 - Crazy that waste quantities have stabilized considering all the things that have NOT been happening still and not operational.
 - Vancouver is down, mostly due to C&D at landfill. The transfer station is trending flat between 2019 and 2020. Back to normal
 - Residential/cash customers have gone way up still
 - One compactor down at surrey? I missed what Chris said. Monitoring day by day. Will communicate to customers if encounter any significant impacts that would affect customers.
- 2. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - Budget approved by council yesterday
 - 2021 Rates were approved no changes from council
 - Have the letter on the container fees; will get back to WMABC next week
 - Continue to adapt to covid requirements as needed
- 3. Survey Results Municipalities and Haulers (Assessment of Solid Waste System Study)
 - 40 responses, mostly from waste hauling community
 - Will post results as part of ZWC agenda in January high level summary of data
 - Key things: interest in longer hours, and looking at rate structure
 - Will share as soon as we post the results with ZWC agenda
- 4. E-waste and battery Promotion Results
 - Lori: reshared some of the material and got good response on their social media
 - MV ran a small promotion in late Oct / early November to encourage residents to recycle their e-waste and used batteries.
 - The promotion drove residents to www.mvrecycles.org to find locations to recycle their e-waste/batteries at no additional cost.
 - MV worked with EPR program reps and municipalities to further amplify the message across the region. Had shared material with you as well –any uptake?
 - Waste Reduction Week was leveraged to further amplify this message, including specific social posts that were scheduled to coincide with WRW themed days (there were two days that aligned perfectly to e-waste and battery recycling).

NOTES:

- The video placements in particular saw high View-Through rates which is great for an awareness campaign. YouTube was over 50% and Facebook was over 30%. Typically we see around 40% and 15% in these platforms.
- Definitions of terms:
- Impressions: the number o times your ad is displayed on someone's feed. No matter if it

was clicked or not.

- Unique Users: Individual, or an individual computer or device. Impressions may include multiple ads served to the same unique user.
- View-Through rate: number of completed video views (from start to finish).






Illegal Dumping Activity in Metro Vancouver

 - Grant asked: what other material would be with the "mixed recyclable materials" → Chris: typically materials that a processor might handle and is an off-stream. Residual material that contains mixed recyclables – cardboard, plastic are the two big ones.
 - If cardboard is over 5%, then they get surcharged as cardboard. But if they have multiple materials that TOGETHER make up 5%, then they go in this mixed category.
 - d. Municipal Illegal Dumping Data (Attachment 3)
 - Asked if we have data for Nov and Dec → we have partial, but not full submissions from municipalities
 - Out of the number of total illegal dumping, how many tickets were issued and how do they track it back to the people responsible?
 - Chris underwood: it's extremely difficult. Unless there is something else dumped with the gypsum indicating location, or if there's a witness or video footage. Otherwise there is no recourse. Hard to prove, but we have seen some success over the last few years. Push hard on trying to make a case. Implied threat is successful, bring ppl into court and they plead guilty

- Paul: when we report to Zero Waste, we'll ensure we have info from munis on what their enforcement process is and how successful it is.
- Chris: for the gypsum graph, it seems like there is a drop at every Q1/Q2. Wondering why. Maybe more building activity happening in Spring/summer. Some seasonality to the data. Maybe something to do with large item pickup, pop up junk programs.
- Lori: asked other than gypsum what's being dumped? → Mattresses, bulky furniture, household garbage and construction waste are main items that municipalities find
- e. Waste flows (Attachment 4)
 - Preliminary numbers are in and we are down slightly from last year but not as bad as one may have thought back in March. Last part of year have been picking up ground
 - Langley down in December due to closures and ppl being home, etc.
 - Could be data error. Haven't reconciled for end of year \rightarrow will check it and confirm
 - Maple ridge also down a bit in December could be data error or something with the holidays
 - Larger facilities were up in December compared to previous December opposite of the smaller facilities. Interesting

 - New contractor started May 1, resulting in 30% lower inspection rate due to transition, training, and reduced hours. Surcharge rate was consistent with previous months.
 - June numbers should reflect a more normal level
 - Grant asked what the history of the company that's doing the inspections now is:
 - Chris: they do pipe inspection work for Metro Vancouver in other departments. Now they've branched out and were successful with this contract, hired staff for it, one inspector came over from the Southern Cross team. Seem to be up and running and it's going well so far.
 - Grant asked if there's a big turnover of the inspectors themselves:
 - Chris: in general, it seems to be more stable than the staffing at the recycling and waste centres. Generally, the inspectors seemed to be more consistent – less staff turnover
 - c. Waste flows (Attachment 3)
 - Waste flows up all around
 - A lot of increase in Vancouver was coming out of the C&D facilities (40% jump in Vancouver) not just residential garbage. But it's still lower than 2019 May... probably in Vancouver in 2019 they had the same C&D/demo material at that time. Maybe we have less commercial
 - Albert: big drop has been in commercial waste in last few years
 - Differences are even more apparent at the landfill where the increase due to C&D/demo is really apparent
 - Extract the demo numbers (exclude demo garage) for the City of Vancouver waste flows for next time. So it's more comparable to MV numbers, likely will show we're down from 2019 but we'll come back with that data
 - At VSTS, you can see that it's actually comparable / a bit of a drop from 2019 numbers. More

correlated to the drop in commercial waste quantities. Due to rerouting and more significantly just businesses are closed. There is one hauler where we have unexplained differences in the amount of waste they are bringing into the MV system

- Non-account is still quite a bit up; smaller transfer stations are still quite a bit higher than 2019
- Large transfer stations are tracking similar to or slightly under 2019 numbers
- Will be interesting to see what happens as restaurants and offices get up and running more fully.
- WMABC asked about waste flow projections this year:
 - Chris: we're projecting that by year-end we will be around 900,000MT garbage, so slightly below 2019 but higher than 2020. A couple more months of data will really help determine/fine-tune our projections
- 2. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - Not much change
 - Repairs went smoothly
 - Everything going fairly well
 - Power issue a couple days ago resulted in delays but up and running again in half an hour (at VSTS)
- 3. United Boulevard Recycling and Waste Centre Follow-ups
 - Scheduling opportunity for trucks to test run various features at the facility (Commercial Vehicle Access and Uses (Clean-out Area, De-tarping hot load)
 - Not quite ready to schedule this yet
 - o Don't have a firm opening date for United Boulevard yet
 - $\circ~$ As soon as we know when we're able to schedule this, we will do so by connecting with Lori
 - Lights/interchange on United Boulevard and King Edward
 - o Main entrance of facility is set up for signalization in future
 - Spoke with City and they're open to monitoring the situation. If signalization is needed, it's easy to set it up
 - Will share info with City and make decision in future, and work with operator with any issues around the entrance
 - King Edward left turn going north onto king ed from united boulevard monitored with cameras, and left turn light is controlled by a smart camera that monitors vehicles in the left turn lane going north. Controls the length of light based on amount of vehicles. So it should respond automatically to heavier traffic without additional adjustments
- 4. Facility Hours and Tipping Fee Structure Review presentation and questionnaire dry-run
 - North Surrey in summer, 5-6pm isn't really being used too much. More so with landscaping customers but not so much for commercial customers
 - North Shore similar story, but even less use from 3pm onwards

- Coquitlam open til 6pm year round. Big drop off after 4 but there is still some usage from 5-6pm year round (higher compared to the other facilities). Many hauling companies are based in this area
- Waste-to-energy facility usage there is some usage from 5-6 and 6-7pm, but by 7pm it really
 peters out to virtually nothing until the morning
- Questions around hours of operation:
 - After 6pm, you get to a whole new structure in terms of staffing will need to add shifts
 - **Grant**: the main issues are in the emergency situation where on a one off scenario we need a facility open a bit earlier, can call in and get them to wait. Maybe a process like that would be more useful.
 - Paul: given the scale of the system, it's a hard thing to implement
 - Not a simple thing to have a reliable thing where someone can open the scale on call. Security issues exist too.
 - Paul would rather have posted hours that are publicly announced and have good service for everyone
 - **Noel**: for that last hour from 5-6pm, do you need that facility completely staffed for that one hour, or could you have fewer staff and still manage safely?
 - Paul: yes they do have less staff at less busy times of the day
 - Paul: for the engagement, we should add a slide on these types of considerations of extending hours (issues around cost, challenges from human resources perspective for the contractor, could you do emergency open scenario, etc)

- Questions on tipping fee structure:

- **Grant**: asked if there's been consideration about taking \$1.3M revenue shortfall and distributing it among the medium, small, and municipal loads as well (not just the large loads).
 - Paul: it's the haulers that get the benefit of reducing the large loads, so
 rationale is they would just bear the cost. But one option is that everyone
 bears the cost. If we asked that question of course haulers would say yes
 distribute to everyone, but that's not fair as the medium and small loads
 aren't part of the survey
- \circ **Lori**: the 3rd question could become a two-part question:
 - Would you support increasing the tip fee to offset reduced revenues
 - Does it make sense to increase only large load rate or distribute added cost to everybody
- Grant: Original Purpose behind differential rates per load size was to recognize cost of processing small loads. If the cost is spread through all the rates, would it be done on an equal basis? Based on some sort of proportional measurement?
 - If you distribute over everybody, equally, it ends up being \$1-2 per tonne increase. Add this column to the table too with this scenario

- Grant: Industry will need some sort of messaging from MV for customers to explain the change in rates.
- Target a 1-hour workshop for Late June at this point. Goal is to do any changes for the October budget report. Let us know if this plan looks ok for your industry
- Can add a slide with a chart showing the rate per tonne and how it changes over the load weight. Simple way to show the concept that you have the rate per tonne flat, then gradually drops, then flattens again. Just to show conceptually how it works
- We will send the powerpoint presentation today to this group, and then send an updated version when we have one

 - The feedback from the questionnaire will be provided to the same waste and recycling industry group that was invited to the webinar. Then, any adjustments that will be made will be communicated as we're making the adjustments

- Dave requested data broken down with illegally dumped drywall specifically

Lynn provided an update before the meeting that Paul communicated at the meeting: *There will be a temporary suspension of construction and demolition processing residual waste at the Landfill starting on October 15. This is needed to prevent the Landfill from exceeding its maximum allowable discharge authorized by the Province.*
- 3. Zero Waste Committee reports of interest September 10, 2021
 - a. 2020 Disposal Ban Program Update
 - Paul noted that the report had been delayed so we had enough time to communicate with everyone. No issues were raised at committee.
 - Paul let everyone know about the relaxation of disposal ban surcharges for waxy cardboard, since there aren't enough recycling options. Grant confirmed that the material was previously accepted by organics processors but most are no longer taking it.

- b. Illegal Dumping in Metro Vancouver
 - Adriana attended the meeting to give the presentation on illegal dumping, including the slide on illegal dumping of gypsum as requested in the July meeting.
- c. Continuous Improvement, Innovation, and Collaboration with Adjacent Regional Districts
 - Paul noted that MV is working on report to evaluate and compare different technology options for managing garbage that are in use around the world.
- 4. Industry Advisory Committee/ SWMP Advisory Committee Update
 - Paul noted that the Industry Advisory Committee is intended to go on indefinitely, where the SWMP Advisory committee will be in place only for the SWMP consultation process.
 - For the IAC draft terms of reference were sent out and feedback received was positive. Terms of reference have been adopted.

- 1. Storm Impacts discussed issues arising from the November 15th flood and resulting road closures cutting off many areas of BC.
 - Paul issued a temporary waiver for food waste disposal bans in the Metro Vancouver system.
 - RecycleBC has stopped glass and EPS collection temporarily.
 - Lori has requested that disposal bans be temporarily waived for all recyclable materials. Haulers are having issues with high volumes and vectors due to the closure of recycling and organics processing facilities. Paul said that he will look at that option, explaining that it would apply only to recyclable materials and not operationally hazardous material bans.
 - Haulers are also having issues with employees who are not able to get to work.
 - Grant noted that materials coming from the Fraser Valley will likely be coming into our system. Paul informed WMABC that MV will be meeting with the Province to discuss acceptance of out of region garbage.
 - Noel asked if there was potential to store materials at the new United Boulevard facilities. Paul said this is not being considered at this time.
 - Dave expressed concern that volumes could be extremely high in the next week or so with cleanup efforts from the flood. Dave also noted that haulers are trying to move as much material as possible and that many hauling routes behind schedule.
 - Paul noted that we will have inspectors stationed at the eastern facilities to make sure that new customers understand site restrictions.

 - Unattended scales trials are underway this week.
 - City of Vancouver is having trouble moving mattresses right now due to road closures. They may have to stop accepting them if another recycling solution is not found.
- 4. Zero Waste Committee reports of interest November 17, 2021
 - Paul reviewed November meeting report highlights including SWMP engagement status, single use items report, Ecowaste report.
 - Paul noted that the Zero Waste Committee will not be providing a position on Ecowaste's application for a 20-year extension of landfill operations within the ALR. Lori noted that they provided feedback on behalf of Ecowaste regarding potential unintended consequences if the extension is not granted.
- 5. Industry Advisory Committee/ SWMP Advisory Committee Update
 - Paul and Sarah noted that the process to launch the technical and advisory committees is currently underway.
- 6. Action items –

a. United Boulevard tour and test run (Paul Litt) – Paul Litt to email Lori with potential dates – MV will be targeting a stakeholder event in mid-December. More information will be shared once the date is confirmed.

b. Communicate United Boulevard opening date (Paul Henderson) – Targeting January 3rd for opening.

c. Report back on whether summer hours can be maintained at North Surrey and the North Shore Recycling and Waste Centres. (Paul Litt/ Chris) – complete – summer hours will be maintained.

Next meeting: We will skip December and resume meetings in January.

- 1. Coquitlam Temporary Closure
 - Chris presented a status update on the damage to bay door #3 at the Coquitlam Recycling and Waste Centre at the WMABC members meeting on Jan 19th. Paul Litt showed the design plan for scaffolding repairs. Targeting later next week to re-open.
 - Grant noted that only one lane of traffic is currently getting through on United Boulevard near the new facility. *MV to look at traffic impacts on access roads prior to the new facility opening.*
 - Lori requested daily updates on the recycling and waste centre opening via SMS messaging. *Chris to* send out an SMS status update on Friday and another one on Sunday or Monday with the latest information.
- 2. New Facility Updates
 - Paul noted that an opening date has not been set yet for United Boulevard. Once occupancy is granted the contractors will need ~ 2 weeks prior to opening.
 - Targeting end of March to complete construction for Central Surrey. Opening planned for late June.
- 3. MV Facility Operational Updates
 - a. Waste-to-Energy Turnaround Times (Attachment 1)
 - b. Disposal ban surcharge data (Attachment 2)
 - Discussed impacts from disposal ban waivers in November/ December.
 - c. Waste Flows (Attachment 3)
 - Reviewed monthly and weekly waste flow charts.
 - Noted that the monthly facility data and the demo garbage chart were missing from the package. Lynne to send additional charts out to the group.
- 4. City of Vancouver Operational Updates
 - Lynn noted that there was a big spike in demo garbage (C&D facility residuals) received at VLF last week. The disposal rate for this material will increase to \$150/tonne starting on March 2.

- Discussed waste flows to Vancouver Landfill in 2022 expecting to have less Iona grit dump material and potentially divert some bottom ash from beneficial use pilot projects.
- Albert noted that City of Vancouver is monitoring staffing at facilities due to COVID related employee illness. No service impacts to date.
- Discussed vaccination policies none of the large haulers are implementing mandatory vaccines that they are aware of since it is already difficult to get drivers. Lori referenced an article saying that approximately 13% of the trucking industry Canada wide is unvaccinated. Currently the US is not requiring truck drivers crossing the border to be vaccinated but that is coming.
- 5. Zero Waste Committee reports of interest January 20, 2021
 - Paul summarized reports presented to committee.
- 6. Industry Advisory Committee/ SWMP Advisory Committee Update
 - Sarah presented information on the new committees at the members meeting on Jan 19th
 - Sarah noted that information on engagement opportunities has been sent out via emails and SMS
 - Lori sent out information to WMABC membership regarding the committees, noting the Jan 31st deadline to sign up.
- 7. Action items
 - a. Update on temporary disposal ban waivers
 - Paul noted that the waxed cardboard disposal ban waivers have been extended and will be revisited in the next Tipping Fee Bylaw review.
 - All other disposal ban waivers have now expired. Disposal ban activity is back to normal.
