Upcoming Work

Metro Vancouver is replacing the Central Park Water Main to help ensure the continued delivery of high-quality drinking water well into the future. In addition to meeting growing regional needs, this new water main is also designed to withstand major earthquakes. Spanning approximately 12 kilometres across the cities of Burnaby and New Westminster, construction first began in 2019 and has been phased over several years.

The Imperial Section is 3.4 kilometres and runs along Imperial Street between Maywood Street at Telford Avenue, and Griffiths Avenue at Elwell Street. Construction of this section started on Imperial Street, just east of Empress Avenue.

Traffic, Safety, and Impacts


- **Road Closure:** There will be a full road closure on Imperial Street from Empress Avenue to Ashworth Street, from January 6 to late March, 2025.
- **Pedestrian Walkway Closure:** Along the north side of Imperial Street between Empress Avenue and Ashworth Avenue. If anyone in your household has mobility issues or medical needs, please contact our community liaison and they will assist you.
- **Parking Restrictions:** There will be no access or parking within the road closure area.
- **Traffic Detours:** The following traffic detours will be in effect. Please follow signage and direction from traffic control personnel.
 - Local Traffic Only:
 - Sperling Avenue, between Stanley Street and Imperial Street
 - Imperial Street, between Ashworth Street and Griffiths Avenue
 - School Pick-Up and Drop-Off Detour: Vehicles can continue to access the following routes. No stopping or parking is permitted in laneways.

- Brantford Avenue: Remains the main point for pick-up and drop-off; no stopping in front of the school
- Imperial Street: North on Empress Avenue to the Empress Avenue roundabout
- Stanley Street: South on the laneway to Empress Avenue roundabout
- Noise: Residents may hear noise from heavy machinery and increased truck traffic.

Garbage Removal: We are coordinating services with the City of Burnaby to keep garbage and recycling pick up in the laneway.

Hours of Work

Typical hours of work will be Monday to Friday between 7:00 am and 5:00 pm.



All work will comply with the City of Burnaby bylaws or granted bylaw variances. There may be times when construction crews work longer hours to complete critical activities safely and efficiently. Metro Vancouver will notify the community in advance about activities outside of bylaw hours.
